INTRODUCTION

Scope of this catalogue

The purpose of this special 10th year catalogue is to provide a convenient and comprehensive guide to the Official Records and publications and periodicals of the United Nations which have been issued since the beginning of the Organization. The catalogue covers the period from 1945 to 1955 (from the 1945 San Francisco Conference to December 1954) and replaces all previous catalogues.

All Official Records of the United Nations can be purchased in final printed form, by the public. The studies and reports of the Secretariat which provide information of a general or technical character are also for sale.

The catalogue also includes information concerning the following: League of Nations publications; documents of the San Francisco Conference and the Preparatory Commission of the United Nations (San Francisco and London, 1945); mimeographed documents of the United Nations; visual material; special informational services in connection with radio and television. The publications of the specialized agencies are *not* included (see end of Introduction and page 238).

Official Records of the United Nations

Official Records comprise verbatim or summary records of discussions at meetings of the General Assembly, Security Council, Economic and Social Council, Trusteeship Council, Atomic Energy Commission and Disarmament Commission. They are listed by session or year for each organ.

The subjects of discussion at the meetings of the various organs are not shown, with the exception of the Security Council. This information is indicated in the titles of some of the Official Records; precise details will be found in the following:

The five official languages of the United Nations are English, Chinese, French, Russian, Spanish. The records of the General Assembly, Security Council, Atomic Energy Commission and Disarmament Commission are published in these five languages, while those of the Economic and Social Council are published in English, French and since 1953, Spanish, and in some cases in the other official languages; the records of the Trusteeship Council appear in English and French. It should be noted, however, that all Resolutions issued in the Official Records series are published in the five official languages. Where editions are available in the official languages this is indicated by the appropriate initial in the left-hand column of each page: E (English), F (French), E/F (English-French in one volume), S (Spanish), R (Russian), C (Chinese).

Secretariat studies and reports

For convenience in research and identification, Secretariat studies and reports have been divided into seventeen categories, each of which is indicated by a Roman

numeral. Some of these divisions have been further subdivided and these subdivisions are indicated by initials immediately following the Roman numeral, e.g. II.A. Economic Stability and Employment Studies. II.B. Economic Development Studies.

Complete identification is provided by the use of a sales number which, in addition to the Roman numeral indicated above, comprises the year of publication and a final identity number of the particular publication. Sales numbers are indicated in the left-hand column of each page, e.g. 1953.1.7 Everyman's United Nations

Within the sales category divisions the publications and periodicals have been arranged by subject matter in order to facilitate research. There is an index at the end of the catalogue.

Secretariat studies and reports are usually published in English and French, and on certain occasions in Spanish. Also, the Department of Public Information arranges for some of its publications to be issued in additional languages to meet specific demands.

Periodicals

The United Nations publishes periodicals covering almost all phases of its work. These periodicals are listed in the catalogue in the relevant category and references are given under Periodicals in the index. They may be purchased separately or by subscription. Generally speaking, subscriptions are paid yearly.

Prices

Prices are given in U.S. dollars, pounds sterling and Swiss francs. All publications can be purchased in other national currencies through the authorized sales agents. The prices quoted do not include postal charges.

How to order United Nations publications

When ordering United Nations publications the following details must be given:

- (1) For Official Records of the General Assembly, Economic and Social Council, and the Trusteeship Council: give the session, the title (indicating whether meetings or annexes) or the supplement number.
- (2) For Official Records of the Security Council, the Atomic Energy Commission and the Disarmament Commission: give the year, the number of the meeting or the title of the supplement.
- (3) For Secretariat studies and reports: give the title and the sales number, the sales number assures accuracy and assists prompt despatch of orders.

In all cases the language required must be stated. If the above procedure is followed, all orders and enquiries can be executed promptly.

Where to place an order

At the end of this catalogue is a list of firms and organizations which have been appointed authorized sales agents from which United Nations publications may be purchased. Consult your sales agent, who will be glad to assist you in the proper sclection of United Nations publications and who will be able to obtain any material you require if not in his stock. If there is no local sales agent, or in the event of some special enquiry or circumstance, enquiries should be sent to the Sales and Circulation Section, United Nations, New York; or to the Sales Section, United Nations Office, Palais des Nations, Geneva, Switzerland. The United Nations offices are not staffed or equipped to conduct extensive mail order operations, and therefore faster service is assured for orders sent directly to sales agents.

United Nations Bookshop

The United Nations Bookshop in the public lobby of the General Assembly Building in New York is maintained for the convenience of visitors to Headquarters. All the publications of the United Nations and also a large selection of the publications of the specialized agencies, and of the International Court of Justice, can be purchased there. The Bookshop is *not* equipped to deal with mail orders: these *must* be sent to the sales agents.

Information on current publications

Descriptive brochures and leaflets listing new publications are issued from time to time by the United Nations through its sales agents from whom they may be obtained. Special requests for a bulk-supply of these brochure-catalogs (for organizations wishing to include them in their own mail to their members) may also be addressed to the Sales and Circulation Section, United Nations, New York; or the Sales Section, United Nations Office, Palais des Nations, Geneva, Switzerland. Requests must state: (a) the subject (economic, legal, social, human rights, etc.); (b) professional or occupational interest; (c) name and address in full.

The monthly United Nations Documents Index also contains current information on publications and documents for sale (see page 13).

Standing orders

The United Nations has, through some of its major sales agents, established a plan for filling "standing orders" for all or various series of Official Records and Secretariat studies, but not periodicals. Under this arrangement, publications are mailed by the agent immediately they are available, and later invoices are rendered at intervals for the publications dispatched. Note that subscriptions to periodicals must be entered separately.

Format and binding

The format of United Nations publications is now generally $8\frac{1}{2}$ " x 11" or 6" x 9". A few are, however, issued in different sizes, particularly the yearbooks and the booklets prepared by the Department of Public Information.

The majority of the publications are issued in paper-bound editions. Where cloth-bound editions are available, this is indicated.

United Nations mimeographed documents

Printed publications of the United Nations which are for sale should not be confused with documents that are issued in mimeographed form or by other reproduction processes. Such documents include preliminary working versions of Secretariat studies and reports, advances records of meetings, etc. In this preliminary form they are produced primarily for the use of Member States and of the Secretariat. When in final form they are printed and are then available to the public.

Introduction

Whether mimeographed or in any other form, documents that are available, as well as all printed publications, may be consulted in Depository Libraries for United Nations Documents and Publications in many countries throughout the world. (See list beginning on page 240.)

Lists of current documents, whether mimeographed or in any other form, and of all printed publications, will be found, if available, in the *United Nations Documents Index* described on page 13.

For the convenience of research centres or groups, scholars, and librarians, the United Nations has made the following arrangements to meet special needs:

- 1. Subscriptions will be received for the mimeographed documents of the various United Nations organs (see pages 234-235). Many of these documents in *final form*, appear in the *printed* Official Records.
- 2. Special requests for the purchase of a supply of a *specific document*, or a certain number of documents, should be addressed directly to the Publishing Services Division, United Nations, New York.

Document symbols

When ordering United Nations publications the sales number only is required (shown in left-hand margin) or — in the case of Official Records — the organ session or year, and the item. However, for the convenience of librarians and research workers, the official document numbers of publications are also shown in this catalogue. The document symbol appears in parentheses following the title e.g. (A/2663).

Specialized agencies of the United Nations

The specialized agencies of the United Nations have *separate* publications programmes and their books and periodicals are *not* included in this catalogue Enquiries should be addressed directly to the agency concerned; a list of all agencies will be found on pages 238-239 of this catalogue. As part of its information programme, however, the United Nations issues some publications on the general scopt and activities of the specialized agencies and these will be found in Category I of this catalogue.

Summary of Illicit Transactions and Seizures Reported to the Secretariat of the United Nations

Under the terms of the Convention of 13 July 1931 as amended by the Protocol of 11 December 1946, the Secretariat receives reports of illicit transactions and seizures from governments that are the contracting parties. Periodic publication of the summaries of these reports by the United Nations began in 1946 and since January 1948 these summaries have appeared every two months. A volume number and issue number first appeared as part of the title with Volume III, No. 4.

The summaries, classified according to a particular drug, contain the following information: Time and place of seizure; kind and quantity of narcotics seized; details regarding ships, vehicles and/or aircraft involved; details regarding persons and/or firms involved; origin of narcotics seized; judicial proceedings; an account of the transactions and methods used to bring about seizure and prosecution of offenders. Included in each issue are a list of names of persons, firms, etc.; a list of localities of seizures; commencing with Volume IV, No. 3 a list of ships implicated.

Estimated World Requirements of Narcotic Drugs

These statements first appeared under the United Nations imprint with the publication of the Third Supplement to the Estimated World Requirements of Dangerous Drugs in 1946. The title of the series changed in 1947 to Estimated World Requirements of Narcotic Drugs. The statements are drawn up from information submitted by governments that are contracting parties to the Convention of 13 July 1931 and the Protocols of 11 December 1946 and 19 November 1948. Requirements are estimated for an entire year on the basis of this information and subsequently modified by amendments published regularly as four supplements to the annual statement.

There has been no textual editing in this edition. The material has been reproduced photo-lithographically from the mimeographed, printed or photo-lithographed originals.

When the Preparatory Commission was not in session, its powers and functions were exercised by the Executive Committee of the Preparatory Commission.


