SUMMARY STATEMENT BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL ON MATTERS  
OF WHICH THE SECURITY COUNCIL IS SEIZED AND ON THE  
STAGE REACHED IN THEIR CONSIDERATION

Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 4030th meeting, held on 3 August 1999 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations.

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representative of Bosnia and Herzegovina, at her request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

The President drew attention to a draft resolution (S/1999/834) that had been prepared in the course of the Council's prior consultations.

The Security Council proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/1999/834, and adopted it unanimously as resolution 1256 (1999) (for the text, see S/RES/1256 (1999); to be issued in Official Records of the Security Council, Fifty-fourth Year, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 1999).

The situation in Timor (see S/11593/Add.50 and 51; S/11935/Add.15 and 16; and S/1999/25/Add.17, 22 and 25)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 4031st meeting, held on 3 August 1999 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations, having before it a letter dated 28 July 1999 from the Secretary-General addressed to the President of the Security Council (S/1999/830).

The President drew attention to a draft resolution (S/1999/843) that had been prepared in the course of the Council's prior consultations.

The Security Council proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/1999/843, and adopted it unanimously as resolution 1257 (1999) (for the text, see S/RES/1257 (1999); to be issued in Official Records of the Security Council, Fifty-fourth Year, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 1999).

The situation concerning the Democratic Republic of the Congo (see S/1997/40/Add.21; S/1998/44/Add.35 and 49; and S/1999/25/Add.10, 13 and 24; see also S/1996/15/Add.43-45; S/1997/40/Add.5, 7, 9, 13, 16 and 17; and S/1998/44/Add.28)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 4032nd meeting, held on 6 August 1999 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations, having before it the report of the Secretary-General on the United Nations preliminary deployment in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (S/1999/790).

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representative of the Democratic Republic of the Congo, at his request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

The President drew attention to a draft resolution (S/1999/852) that had been prepared in the course of the Council's prior consultations.

The Security Council proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/1999/852, and adopted it unanimously as resolution 1258 (1999) (for the text, see S/RES/1258 (1999); to be issued in Official Records of the Security Council, Fifty-fourth Year, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 1999).
