It was so decided.


Tribute to the memory of His Excellency Mr. Amara Essy, President of the General Assembly at its forty-ninth session


The Acting President: It is my sad duty to pay tribute to the memory of the President of the General Assembly at its forty-ninth session, His Excellency Mr. Amara Essy, of Côte d'Ivoire, who passed away on 8 April. On behalf of the General Assembly, I should like to convey our condolences to the Government and the people of Côte d'Ivoire and to the bereaved family of His Excellency Mr. Amara Essy.

Draft resolution (A/79/L.71)

The Acting President: We shall now proceed to consider draft resolution A/79/L.71.

I now give the floor to the representative of the Secretariat.

Mr. Nakano (Department for General Assembly and Conference Management): The present oral statement is made in the context of rule 153 of the rules of procedure of the General Assembly. The present statement has also been distributed to Member States.

Under the terms of operative paragraph 1 of the draft resolution, the General Assembly would welcome and accept with appreciation the generous offer of the Government of Turkmenistan to host the third United Nations Conference on Landlocked Developing Countries and would decide that the Conference will be held in Awaza for a duration of four days, from 5 to 8 August 2025, at the highest possible level, including Heads of State and Government, on the theme "Driving progress through partnerships".

Should the Assembly adopt draft resolution A/79/L.71, there would be additional meetings and documentation workload for the Department for General Assembly and Conference Management and the Department of Global Communications, with a total estimated cost of \$254,700 in 2025. Every effort will be made to meet the requirements within their capacity, and there would be no programme budget implications for 2025. In this regard, the Secretariat wishes to inform the Assembly that its ability to implement the mandate will depend on the availability of adequate liquidity resources.

The Assembly may recall that, in accordance with its decision in its resolution 77/246 to convene the third United Nations Conference on Landlocked Developing Countries in 2024, provisions totalling \$345,500 were included in the programme budget for 2024 under section 2, "General Assembly and Economic and Social Council Affairs and Conference Management", and section 28, "Global Communications". The unspent provisions owing to the postponement of the third United Nations Conference, as decided by the Assembly in its decision 79/537, will be returned in the context of the financial performance report for 2024 to be presented at the main part of the eightieth session of the General Assembly.

Also, pursuant to operative paragraph 1 of the draft resolution, it should be noted that the Government of Turkmenistan will need to defray the additional cost directly or indirectly involved, in accordance with paragraph 5 of resolution 40/243, which stipulates that United Nations bodies may hold sessions away from their established headquarters when a Government issuing an invitation for a session to be held within its territory has agreed to defray such costs, after consultation with the Secretary-General as to the nature and possible extent of the actual and additional cost directly or indirectly involved.

I should like to announce that since the submission of the draft resolution, and in addition to the delegations listed in document A/79/L.71, the following countries have also become sponsors of the draft resolution: Austria, Belgium, Bhutan, Botswana, Bulgaria, the Central African Republic, China, Croatia, Cuba, Cyprus, Czechia, El Salvador, Finland, Gambia, Georgia, Germany, Greece, Indonesia, the Islamic Republic of Iran, Ireland, Italy, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Latvia, Lesotho, Luxembourg, Mali, Malta, Mongolia, Morocco, Mozambique, the Kingdom of the Netherlands, Paraguay,

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the Philippines, Poland, Portugal, the Republic of Moldova, the Russian Federation, Rwanda, Spain, Sweden, Tajikistan, Timor-Leste, Türkiye, Uganda, the United Republic of Tanzania, Uzbekistan, Viet Nam, Zambia and Zimbabwe.

The Acting President: I thank the representative of the Secretariat.

Reports of the Fifth Committee

The positions of delegations regarding the recommendations of the Committee have been made clear in the Committee and are reflected in the relevant official records. Therefore, if there is no proposal under rule 66 of the rules of procedure, I shall take it that the General Assembly decides not to discuss the reports of the Committee that are before the Assembly today.

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The Acting President: Statements will therefore be limited to explanations of vote. May I remind members that, in accordance with decision 34/401, a delegation should, as far as possible, explain its vote only once, that is, either in the Committee or in plenary meeting, unless that delegation's vote in plenary meeting is different from its vote in the Committee and that explanations of vote are limited to 10 minutes and should be made by delegations from their seats. When there are multiple proposals under an agenda item, statements in explanation of vote before the vote on any or all of them should be made in one intervention, followed by action on all of them, one by one. Thereafter, there will be an opportunity for statements in explanation of vote after the vote on any or all of them in one intervention.

Before we begin to take action on the recommendations contained in the reports of the Committee, I would like to advise representatives that we will proceed to take decisions in the same manner as was done in the Committee, unless the Secretariat is notified otherwise in advance, aside from the recommendations resulting from secret ballot. I should therefore hope that we may proceed to adopt without a vote those recommendations that were adopted without a vote in the Committee.

I would like to draw the attention of members to a note by the Secretariat entitled "Recommendations contained in the reports of the Fifth Committee for consideration by the General Assembly", which has been issued as document A/C.5/79/INF/3, to cover items other than sub-items (b) and (l) of agenda item 116.

Members are reminded that additional sponsors are no longer accepted now that the draft resolutions and decisions have been adopted by the Committee. Any clarification about sponsorship of the Committee reports should be addressed to the Secretary of the Committee.

Furthermore, any corrections to the voting intention of delegations after the voting has concluded on a proposal should be addressed directly to the Secretariat after the meeting. I count on members' cooperation in avoiding any interruptions to our proceedings in that regard.
