**Report of the Secretary-General on the situation in South Sudan
(S/2025/211)**

The President (*spoke in French*): The Security Council will now begin its consideration of the item on its agenda.

I wish to draw the attention of Council members to document S/2025/211, which contains the report of the Secretary-General on the situation in South Sudan.

Members of the Council have before them document S/2025/259, which contains the text of a draft resolution submitted by the United States of America.

The Council is ready to proceed to the vote on the draft resolution before it. I shall put the draft resolution to the vote now.

The President (*spoke in French*): The draft resolution received 15 votes in favour. The draft resolution has been adopted unanimously as resolution 2778 (2025).
