
Letter dated 29 May 2025 from the Permanent Representative of the Sudan to the United Nations addressed to the President of the Security Council

I have the honour to transmit herewith a press statement issued by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of the Sudan dated 29 May 2025, concerning recent allegations regarding the purported use of chemical weapons in the Sudan (see annex).

In line with its unwavering commitment to its international obligations, including under the Chemical Weapons Convention, and in adherence to the principle of transparency, the Government of the Sudan has taken prompt and responsible action to address these unfounded claims. As mentioned in the attached statement, the President of the Sovereignty Council has issued a decision to establish a national committee tasked with thoroughly investigating the matter and submitting its report without delay.

I should be grateful if the present letter and its annex could be circulated as a document of the Security Council.

The committee is to submit its report without delay.
