Tenth emergency special session

Letter dated 9 June 2025 from the Secretary-General addressed to the President of the General Assembly

1. At present, four Member States are in arrears under the terms of Article 19 of the Charter of the United Nations, which states:

A Member of the United Nations which is in arrears in the payment of its financial contributions to the Organization shall have no vote in the General Assembly if the amount of its arrears equals or exceeds the amount of the contributions due from it for the preceding two full years. The General Assembly may, nevertheless, permit such a Member to vote if it is satisfied that the failure to pay is due to conditions beyond the control of the Member.

2. The minimum payments necessary to reduce the amounts owed by those Member States on their contributions so that they remain below the gross amount assessed for the preceding two full years (2023 and 2024) are as follows:

<i>Member State</i>	<i>Minimum payment (United States dollars)</i>
Afghanistan	449 775
Bolivia (Plurinational State of)	772 364
Sao Tome and Principe ^a	785 900
Venezuela (Bolivarian Republic of)	115 702 476

^a In its resolution 79/3, the General Assembly decided that Sao Tome and Principe would be permitted to vote in the Assembly until the end of its seventy-ninth session.
