### I. Introduction

- 1. Special procedures are mandated by the Human Rights Council to report to it on their activities (see annex).
- 2. In 2009, the sixteenth annual meeting of special rapporteurs, independent experts and chairs of working groups decided that a joint communications report would be prepared (A/HRC/12/47, paras 24-26), with this decision being reconfirmed by the seventeenth annual meeting in 2010. This was to avoid duplication, rationalize documentation, allow examination of cross cutting issues, and ensure that the content of communications and any follow-up would feed into the universal periodic review mechanism more effectively. Mandate holders decided that the report should contain summaries of communications and statistical information (A/HRC/15/44, para. 26-27).
- 3. The outcome of the review of the work and functioning of the Human Rights Council calls on the Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Human Rights to maintain information on special procedures in a comprehensive and easily accessible manner and encourages the use of modern information technology to reduce the circulation of paper (resolution 16/21, annex, paras. 29 and 60).

### II. Communications sent and replies received

- 4. All communications and their replies are available through the special procedure communications website at the following link: <u>Home Page</u>. This includes short summaries of all allegations communicated to States or other entities. The communications sent and responses received are also accessible at the same location electronically in their entirety through hyperlinks.
- 5. This report covers all urgent appeals, letters of allegation, and other letters sent by special procedures mandate holders between 1 December 2024 and 28 February 2025 and replies received from 1 February until 30 April 2025. Communications sent before 1 December 2024 are reported in previous communications reports submitted to the Council and also made available on the dedicated website: Communications reports of special procedures | OHCHR.
- 6. This report also includes replies received from 1 February until 30 April 2025 relating to communications sent by special procedures mandate holders before 1 February 2025. Some of these replies supplement information communicated earlier by the respective States or other entities. Link to replies is available at Replies received
- 7. The present report contains urgent appeals sent by the Working Group on Arbitrary Detention and the Working Group on Enforced or Involuntary Disappearances and joint urgent appeals sent by them with other mandates. It does not contain other types of communications issued by these mandates, which are processed according to their own distinctive procedures and are reported separately in the annual reports of these two working groups.
- 8. The names of some alleged victims have been redacted to protect their privacy and to prevent further victimization. Names of victims are mentioned only when the individual concerned or their direct family has expressly consented or requested to have his, her or their name in the public report. In the original communications, the full names of the alleged victims were provided to the Government concerned after obtaining their appropriate consent. Names of alleged perpetrators have systematically been redacted in communications and State replies to preserve the presumption of innocence.
- 9. In total, 144 communications were sent during this reporting period to 74 countries to which 56 replies were received from 36 countries as listed below:
