Upon instructions from the Chair of the Investigative Committee of Russia, criminal cases related to the incidents in Bryansk and Kursk Oblasts have been referred to the Main Investigative Department of the Committee.

Svetlana Petrenko, official representative of the Investigative Committee of Russia:

On 31 May 2025 at 10.50 p.m., a road bridge collapsed on the railway line between Vygonichi and Pilshino in Bryansk Oblast. Debris from the bridge fell onto a passenger train passing underneath it. The incident resulted in injuries and fatalities.

On 1 June 2025 at about 3 a.m., a moving train fell from a damaged bridge onto a road in Zheleznogorsk District of Kursk Oblast. The driver and two of his assistants were injured in the incident.

Criminal cases related to these incidents have been assigned by the Chair of the Investigative Committee of Russia to investigators from the Main Investigative Department of the Committee.

Personnel of the Investigative Committee of Russia are currently conducting urgent investigations at the scenes of the incidents with the aim of establishing all the circumstances.
