

Delegations are encouraged to limit their statements for the general debate to a maximum of 8 minutes; statements on behalf of a group of countries should not exceed 12 minutes. The list will give priority to high-level representatives and should be shared with the Committee on a regular basis so as to increase transparency. Wide civil society participation is encouraged. During the debate on the working methods, delegations are encouraged to limit their statements to a maximum of 3 minutes; statements on behalf of a group of countries should not exceed 4 minutes.

^b During thematic discussions, delegations are encouraged to limit their statements to a maximum of 3 minutes; statements on behalf of a group of countries should not exceed 4 minutes.
