## **Report of the ninety-fourth meeting of the Standing Committee (8-9 September 2025)**

### **I. Introduction**

1. The Standing Committee of the Executive Committee of the High Commissioner's Programme (Executive Committee) held its ninety-fourth meeting at the International Conference Center, Geneva from 8 to 9 September 2025.
2. The Chairperson of the Executive Committee, the Permanent Representative of Ecuador to the United Nations Office at Geneva, chaired the ninety-fourth meeting of the Standing Committee.
3. All documents cited in this report and all available presentations made by senior managers of the Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) during the meeting can be found on the Standing Committee webpage.

### **II. Representation**

8. 13 non-governmental organizations were in attendance.

### IV. Work of the ninety-fourth meeting

10. At the start of the meeting, the Deputy High Commissioner gave overarching remarks, highlighting the gravity of the financial crisis affecting UNHCR, which had necessitated significant downsizing and a streamlined operational footprint. Despite the challenges, she reaffirmed the organization's steadfast commitment and prioritization of its core work, including protection, lifesaving assistance and emergency response, and solutions. Additionally, she

emphasized the organization's commitment to maintaining trust and principled action by reinforcing its integrity and accountability frameworks during this period of transition.

11. Presentations under each agenda item were made by senior management of UNHCR, and Executive Committee members and Standing Committee observers were given the opportunity to make comments and ask questions. Comprehensive summary records of the discussion will be made available on the Standing Committee webpage. ## **V. Decision of the Standing Committee of the Executive Committee of the High Commissioner's Programme**

### **Decision on budgets and funding for 2025**

12. At its meeting, on 9 September 2025, the Standing Committee,

Recalling the Executive Committee's decision, at its seventy-fifth session on administrative, financial and programme matters ([A/79/12/Add.1](#) para. 12 (b)), as well as discussions by the Standing Committee on the programme budgets and funding item at its ninety-third meeting in June 2025,

Reaffirming the importance of responsibility-sharing in solidarity with countries hosting refugees,

Takes note of the increase in UNHCR's annual budget for 2025 as at 31 July 2025 to a current total of \$10,604.2 million, representing the sum of the original budget of \$10,247.5 million and supplementary budgets of \$356.7 million;

Recognizes that emergencies and unforeseen activities unfolding in 2025 may result in the need for additional or expanded supplementary budgets and that additional resources, over and above those for existing budgets, would be needed to meet such needs; and

Urges Member States to continue to respond generously with flexible and unearmarked contributions, in the spirit of solidarity and in a timely manner, to the High Commissioner's appeal for resources to meet in full the annual budget for 2025.
