Subject: Films on cellulose nitrate substrate

- 1. A recent study by a specialist from the Netherlands Audiovisual Archives revealed the presence among the films produced or received by the United Nations in the 1950s-1960s that are now stored in the UNOG Library of a number of reels on a cellulose nitrate substrate.
- 2. Cellulose nitrate, the usual substrate for 35 mm films made during that period, is <u>a real fire hazard</u>: at certain temperatures, and after a certain number of years, cellulose nitrate-based films may <u>spontaneously ignite</u>. The fires cannot be put out because the materials generate their own oxygen. Films of this kind must be stored in very special conditions.
- 3. The Library is currently in contact with the Swiss national film library with a view to the conclusion of agreements for the storing of these films which are of undeniable historical value in suitable conditions.
- 4. Anyone knowing of the presence of old films in any UNOG building is requested kindly to inform Ms. Blukacz-Louisfert (Chief, League of Nations Archives Unit, ext. 74189) of their whereabouts.
