Comprehensive review of the whole question of peacekeeping operations in all their aspects

Report of the Special Political and Decolonization Committee (Fourth Committee)

Rapporteur: Mr. Gualberto Rodríguez San Martín (Bolivia)

I. Introduction

1. At its 3rd plenary meeting, on 17 September 1999, the General Assembly, on the recommendation of the General Committee, decided to include in the agenda of its fifty-fourth session the item entitled "Comprehensive review of the whole question of peacekeeping operations in all their aspects" and to allocate it to the Special Political and Decolonization Committee (Fourth Committee).

2. The General Assembly, by its resolution 54/81 of 6 December 1999, requested the Special Committee on Peacekeeping Operations to submit a report on its work to the Assembly at its fifty-fourth session.

3. The Fourth Committee resumed the consideration of agenda item 90, entitled "Comprehensive review of the whole question of peacekeeping operations in all their aspects", at its 25th meeting on 22 May 2000 (see A/C.4/54/SR.25).

4. For its consideration of the item, the Committee had before it the report of the Special Committee on Peacekeeping Operations requested by resolution 54/81 (A/54/839).

5. At the same meeting, the representative of Egypt, in his capacity as Rapporteur of the Special Committee on Peacekeeping Operations, introduced the report of that Committee (see A/C.4/54/SR.25).

6. At the same meeting, the Under-Secretary-General for Peacekeeping Operations made a statement (see A/C.4/54/SR.25).

II. Consideration of draft resolution A/C.4/54/L.21

7. At the 25th meeting, on 22 May, the representative of Egypt, in his capacity as Rapporteur of the Special Committee on Peacekeeping Operations, introduced a draft resolution entitled "Comprehensive review of the whole question of peacekeeping operations in all their aspects" (A/C.4/54/L.21), sponsored by Argentina, Canada, Egypt, Japan, Nigeria and Poland, and orally revised it as follows:

(a) On the first page, the footnote, which read "A/54/87", was replaced by "A/54/839";

(b) In paragraph 2, the words "paragraphs 43 to 130" were replaced by "paragraphs 46 to 171".

8. At the same meeting, the Committee adopted draft resolution A/C.4/54/L.21, as orally revised, without a vote (see para. 9).

III. Recommendation of the Special Political and Decolonization Committee (Fourth Committee)

9. The Special Political and Decolonization Committee (Fourth Committee) recommends to the General Assembly the adoption of the following draft resolution:

Comprehensive review of the whole question of peacekeeping operations in all their aspects

The General Assembly,

Recalling its resolution 2006 (XIX) of 18 February 1965 and all other relevant resolutions,

Recalling in particular its resolution 54/81 of 6 December 1999,

Affirming that the efforts of the United Nations in the peaceful settlement of disputes, including through its peacekeeping operations, are indispensable,

Convinced of the need for the United Nations to continue to improve its capabilities in the field of peacekeeping and to enhance the effective and efficient deployment of its peacekeeping operations,

Considering the contribution that all States Members of the Organization make to peacekeeping,

Taking note of the widespread interest in contributing to the work of the Special Committee on Peacekeeping Operations expressed by many Member States, in particular troop-contributing countries,

Bearing in mind the continuous necessity of preserving the efficiency and strengthening the effectiveness of the work of the Special Committee,

1. Welcomes the report of the Special Committee on Peacekeeping Operations; 1

2. *Endorses* the proposals, recommendations and conclusions of the Special Committee, contained in paragraphs 46 to 171 of its report;

3. Urges Member States, the Secretariat and relevant organs of the United Nations to take all necessary steps to implement the proposals, recommendations and conclusions of the Special Committee;

4. *Reiterates* that those Member States that become personnel contributors to United Nations peacekeeping operations in years to come or participate in the future in the Special Committee for three consecutive years as observers shall, upon request in writing to the Chairman of the Special Committee, become members at the following session of the Special Committee;

5. Decides that the Special Committee, in accordance with its mandate, shall continue its efforts for a comprehensive review of the whole question of peacekeeping operations in all their aspects and shall review the implementation of its previous proposals and consider any new proposals so as to enhance the capacity of the United Nations to fulfil its responsibilities in this field;

6. *Requests* the Special Committee to submit a report on its work to the General Assembly at its fifty-fifth session;

7. *Decides* to include in the provisional agenda of its fifty-fifth session the item entitled "Comprehensive review of the whole question of peacekeeping operations in all their aspects".
