would inevitably necessitate the introduction of changes in the other treaties. It is not possible in practice to synchronize the process, but a lack of synchronization is liable to result in clashes between the provisions of the five treaties.

2. The report on the proceedings of the Workshop on Space Law in the Twenty-first Century, held as part of the Third United Nations Conference on the Exploration and Peaceful Uses of Outer Space (UNISPACE III), contains a list of issues that could be included on the agenda of the Legal Subcommittee of the Committee on the Peaceful Uses of Outer Space. One of those issues is the investigation of the possibility of developing a comprehensive treaty on the law of outer space.¹

3. In view of the foregoing, it is proposed that a single issue/item for discussion entitled "Advisability of developing a single comprehensive United Nations convention on the law of outer space" be included on the agenda for the fortieth session of the Legal Subcommittee.
