Letter dated 8 June 2000 from the Charge d'affaires a.i. of the Permanent Mission of Yugoslavia to the United Nations addressed to the President of the Security Council

In its statement of 7 June 2000 regarding the situation in Kosovo and Metohija, the autonomous province of the Yugoslav constituent Republic of Serbia, which I transmitted under cover of my letter addressed to you yesterday, the Federal Government of the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia demanded from the Security Council to:

- Declare null and void all acts and decisions taken by the Special Representative of the Secretary-General of the United Nations in Kosovo and Head of the United Nations Interim Administration Mission in Kosovo (UNMIK) that are contrary to Security Council resolution 1244 (1999) of 10 June 1999;
- Condemn in the strongest terms, put an end to the activity of the Special Representative and Head of UNMIK and withdraw from Kosovo and Metohija the forces of UNMIK and KFOR who are directly responsible for the systematic violation of Security Council resolution 1244 (1999);
- Urgently take all necessary measures to ensure full and consistent implementation of Security Council resolution 1244 (1999);
- Condemn most strongly the continued aggression of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) against the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia through the maintenance of the illegal system of sanctions and embargoes imposed by its member States, through consistent attempts at undermining the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia and through material, political and media support for Albanian separatists and terrorists in Kosovo and Metohija; and
- Take all necessary measures to compensate for the damage and other losses inflicted on the population, economic and cultural heritage of Kosovo and Metohija by UNMIK and KFOR and by the terrorist and criminal gangs they are supporting.

On behalf of the Federal Government of the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia, I request the Security Council to consider these demands at its forthcoming meeting on 9 June 2000 and to provide an answer.

I also take this opportunity to reiterate my request submitted to the Security Council in my letter of 2 June 2000 to be allowed to participate in the said meeting, sitting at the Council table, and to make a statement.

I should be grateful if you would have the present letter circulated as a document of the Security Council.
