Consideration of the recommendations of the Tenth United Nations Congress on the Prevention of Crime and the Treatment of Offenders

Draft resolution proposed by the Chairman of the Committee of the Whole

The Commission on Crime Prevention and Criminal Justice recommends to the Economic and Social Council the approval of the following draft resolution for adoption by the General Assembly:

Follow-up to the Tenth United Nations Congress on the Prevention of Crime and the Treatment of Offenders

The General Assembly,

Recalling its resolution 54/125 of 17 December 1999,

Taking note with appreciation of the conclusions and recommendations of the Tenth United Nations Congress on the Prevention of Crime and the Treatment of Offenders, held in Vienna from 10 to 17 April 2000, and of the Vienna Declaration on Crime and Justice: Meeting the Challenges of the Twenty-first Century, adopted by the Tenth Congress during its high-level segment, which were considered by the Commission on Crime Prevention and Criminal Justice at its ninth session, held in Vienna from 18 to 20 April 2000,

1. *Urges* Governments, in their efforts to combat crime, especially transnational crime, and to maintain well-functioning criminal justice systems, to be guided by the conclusions and recommendations of the Tenth United Nations Congress on the Prevention of Crime and the Treatment of Offenders;

2. *Requests* the Commission on Crime Prevention and Criminal Justice to consider at its tenth session the findings and recommendations embodied in the Vienna Declaration on Crime and Justice: Meeting the Challenges of the Twenty-first Century, adopted by the Tenth Congress, and, as appropriate, the report of the Tenth Congress;

3. *Also requests* the Commission and the Centre for International Crime Prevention of the Office for Drug Control and Crime Prevention of the Secretariat to draw up appropriate plans of action.
