OVERVIEW OF THE TASKS UNDER THE CONVENTION Note by the secretariat

Introduction

1. The present document is an overview of the tasks under the UN/ECE Convention on the Transboundary Effects of Industrial Accidents at the national, bilateral and intergovernmental levels. It also provides information on the related tasks for the UN/ECE secretariat – column 5.

2. The document was prepared in tabular format for easy reference. The tasks are listed according to subject areas – column 1. Reference to specific provisions of the Convention were included for all the tasks that are compulsory under the Convention. Other tasks that are not compulsory but that had been proposed by the Meeting of the Signatories to the Convention are included in square brackets.

3. The tasks at the intergovernmental level – column 4 – requiring international efforts to be implemented constitute the long-term programme of work under the Convention (CP.TEIA/2000/9, Part One).
