# Note by the Secretary-General

1. As indicated in the note by the Secretary-General dated 26 October 2000 (A/55/102/Add.2), as a result of the resignation of Mr. Neil Francis (Australia) from the Committee on Contributions, the General Assembly will be required at its current session to appoint one person to fill the vacant seat on the Committee for the period beginning on the date of appointment and expiring on 31 December 2001.
