## **Financing of the United Nations Preventive Deployment Force**

### **Report of the Secretary-General\***

#### *Summary*

The present report provides details on the final disposition of the assets of the United Nations Preventive Deployment Force (UNPREDEP). The inventory value of the assets of the Force as at 1 March 2000 amounted to some \$20.2 million, 46 per cent of which have been transferred to the other peacekeeping operations or to the United Nations Logistics Base at Brindisi, Italy, for temporary storage. The disposal of the assets of UNPREDEP has been guided by the principles endorsed by the General Assembly in section VII of its resolution 49/233 A of 23 December 1994.

The actions to be taken by the General Assembly, as set out in paragraph 8 below, are to take note of the present report on the final disposition of assets of UNPREDEP and to approve the donations of assets with total inventory value of \$1,705,200 and corresponding residual value of \$835,300 to the Government of the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia.

## **I. Introduction**

1. By its resolution 795 (1992) of 11 December 1992, the Security Council authorized the deployment of a United Nations presence in the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia. By its resolution 983 (1995) of 31 March 1995, the Council decided that the United Nations Protection Force within the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia should be known as the United Nations Preventive Deployment Force (UNPREDEP).

2. In paragraph 34 of his report to the Security Council (S/1999/161) dated 12 February 1999, the Secretary-General requested the extension of the mandate of UNPREDEP for a period of six months, from 1 March until 31 August 1999. The mandate of the Force, however, was not extended.

3. The present report on the final disposition of the assets of UNPREDEP is submitted pursuant to section VII of General Assembly resolution 49/233 A of 23 December 1994, in which the Assembly endorsed the proposals of the Secretary-General on the disposition of the assets of peacekeeping operations contained in his report of 25 May 1994 (A/48/945, para. 110 (d)) and the recommendations of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions contained in its report of 18 November 1994 (A/49/664, para. 116).

## **II. Classification and disposition of the assets of the United Nations Preventive Deployment Force**

4. The process of liquidating the assets of UNPREDEP was guided by the following principles and policies as approved by the General Assembly in section VII of its resolution 49/233 A:

(a) Equipment in good condition that conforms to established standardization or is considered compatible with existing equipment will be redeployed to other United Nations operations elsewhere in the world or will be placed in reserve to form the start-up kits for use by future missions;

(b) Equipment not required by other peacekeeping missions but which may be useful for operations of other United Nations agencies, international organizations or non-governmental organizations and which it is not feasible to keep in reserve will be sold to a relevant agency or organization;

(c) Any equipment or property not required or which it is not feasible to dispose of in the above manner or which is in poor condition will be subject to commercial disposal in the area of operations, following standard United Nations regulations and procedures;

(d) Any surplus mission assets remaining after disposition under the terms referred to under paragraphs (a) to (c) above and/or any assets which have already been installed in the country and which, if dismantled, would in fact set back the rehabilitation process of the country, will be contributed to the duly recognized Government of the respective country. This refers in particular to airfield installations and equipment, bridges and mine-clearing equipment. All efforts should be made to obtain from the Government its agreement to compensate the United Nations in a mutually acceptable form (contributions, services, tax exemption, etc.) for the residual value of any surplus mission assets installed in the country that

could not be otherwise disposed of. The General Assembly should, as a matter of principle, be requested to approve any such disposition of mission assets, which would provide for free-of-charge contribution to the Government.

5. Based on the inventory records as at 1 March 2000, the assets of UNPREDEP were established at approximately \$20.2 million, at their inventory value. For ease of classification, these assets have been grouped into 11 categories of equipment presented in standard peacekeeping operation budgets: prefabricated buildings, vehicular equipment, communications equipment, office equipment, data-processing equipment, generators, water and septic tanks, refrigeration equipment, miscellaneous equipment, field defence equipment and water purification equipment.

6. In accordance with the principles and policies recalled in paragraph 4 above, the assets of UNPREDEP have been placed into the following three groups and four subgroups, as presented in summarized form in annex I and in detailed form in annexes II to V to the present report:

(a) Group I includes assets identified as meeting the requirements of other United Nations missions. The items in the group, with an inventory value of \$9,218,300 (46 per cent of total asset value), have been transferred to other United Nations missions, the International Tribunal for the Former Yugoslavia, United Nations Headquarters and the United Nations Logistics Base at Brindisi, Italy, for temporary storage pending future use. Details are shown in annex II;

(b) Group II consists of assets with an inventory value of \$6,907,800 and includes two subgroups: (a) items sold, and (b) items donated as follows:

(i) Subgroup II (a), with an inventory value of \$5,202,600 (26 per cent), consists of assets sold to other organizations or within the mission area. A breakdown of the recipients of \$2,391,500 is shown in the table below and more detailed information is contained in annex III. This amount has been credited as miscellaneous income to the UNPREDEP Special Account;

(ii) Subgroup II (b), with an inventory value of \$1,705,200 (8 per cent), consists of observation towers and non-expendable equipment in the observation posts which were donated to the Government of the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia, as shown in annex IV. A cost-benefit analysis was done to determine whether it was cost-effective to do essential road works, dismantle observation posts, transport them to a holding area and then transfer them to the United Nations Logistics Base at Brindisi or to other peacekeeping missions. The results of the analysis showed that, taking into account the residual value of the equipment, which amounted to \$835,300, it was not economical to secure, dismantle, ship and do site restoration of the observation posts. Following the request from the Government of the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia to donate the observation posts, including the equipment within the posts to keep them in operational condition, the assets were donated to the Government under "temporary possession" arrangements, pending the approval by the General Assembly;

(iii) Group III includes two subgroups: III (a), assets written-off, with a total inventory value of \$3,914,900 (19 per cent), and III (b) assets stolen during the course of the mission with an inventory value of \$114,700 (1 per cent). Detailed information is shown in annex V on the assets recommended for write-off by the UNPREDEP Local Property Survey Board, pending approval of such action.

### III. Losses of United Nations property

7. In accordance with subparagraph (c) of General Assembly decision 52/485 of 26 June 1998, detailed information and justification on written-off and lost items is provided below:

(a) *Unaccounted for*: As the liquidation team was not able to identify the names of the officials who received some of the equipment provided to the battalions, including items of welfare, catering, petroleum and miscellaneous equipment, these assets, with total inventory value of \$79,600 and residual value of \$26,200, are being written off as unaccounted for;

(b) *Wear and tear*: Assets with a total inventory value of \$3,389,600 and residual value of \$1,267,000 have been identified as unserviceable due to wear and tear. These include 131 prefabricated buildings, 45 pieces of vehicular equipment, 57 pieces of communications equipment, 54 pieces of office equipment, 826 pieces of data-processing equipment, 45 water tanks, 11 generators, one refrigeration container, two pieces of water purification equipment, 4 observation towers and 346 pieces of miscellaneous equipment. Of these items, 29 prefabricated buildings, 3 pieces of communications equipment, 2 generators, 7 water tanks, one water purification system and 21 pieces of miscellaneous equipment with a total inventory value of \$240,300 and residual value of \$114,800 could not be disassembled and recovered from the immediate border area due to commencement of the NATO campaign in Kosovo in March 1999 and the resultant influx of refugees into the mission area. At the end of the armed conflict it was determined that these items had deteriorated to the point where they were no longer of use to the Organization, owing to their use in relief efforts and because of sustained exposure to weather conditions;

(c) *Accident*: Five light vehicles were written off as a result of traffic accidents in the course of the mission. In addition, 4 pieces of communications equipment, one water tank and two kitchen units were also lost due to accidents. The total inventory value of assets written off due to the accidents amounted to \$123,600. The corresponding residual value is \$45,900;

(d) *Reported lost*: Some assets, including 5 transportation tools, 3 photocopiers, 26 pieces of communications equipment, 30 pieces of data-processing equipment and 146 miscellaneous items with a total inventory value of \$159,400 and residual value of \$64,300, were reported lost during the course of the mission, as detailed in annex V of the present report;

(e) *Unacknowledged transfers*: Assets with a total inventory value of \$12,200 and residual value of \$4,100, including transportation tools and equipment, communications radio equipment and miscellaneous equipment remain unacknowledged as transferred by the United Nations Logistics Base at Brindisi and it is recommended that they be written off from the inventory records;

(f) *Damage*: Assets with a total inventory value of \$135,500 and residual value of \$99,600, including 2 prefabricated buildings, one piece of communications equipment, one photocopier, one facsimile machine and two generators were damaged beyond repair during the course of the mission and recommended for write-off;

(g) *Uneconomical to recover*: Based on the location and conditions of two pieces of radio equipment with a total inventory value of \$15,000 and residual value of \$5,800 it was determined that it would be uneconomical to recover and transfer this equipment. It was therefore recommended that they be written off;

(h) *Theft*: Six light vehicles, four pieces of radio equipment and one piece of welfare equipment with a total inventory value of \$114,700 and residual value of \$51,100 were reported stolen during the course of the mission. Recovery efforts were not successful. It was recommended that this equipment be written off from the inventory records.

#### **IV. Actions to be taken by the General Assembly**

8. **The actions to be taken by the General Assembly are to take note of the present report on the final disposition of assets of UNPREDEP and to approve the donations of assets with total inventory value of \$1,705,200 and corresponding residual value of \$835,300 to the Government of the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia.**
