ANNEX

Statement dated 25 June 1988 concerning the position of  
His Royal Highness Samdech Norodom Sihanouk and the

Jakarta informal meeting

I

BASIC POSITION

With regard to the July Jakarta informal meeting to be attended by the 4 Khmer factions and Mr. Nguyen Co Thach, Deputy Prime Minister and Minister for Foreign Affairs of the Socialist Republic of Vietnam, the two other partners of the Coalition Government of Democratic Kampuchea consider that the following elements expressed time and again by H.R.H. Samdech NORODOM Sihanouk will form the basis of discussion with the Socialist Republic of Vietnam in the proposed meeting:

- (I)- Withdrawal of the Vietnamese forces in three phases under international supervision.
- (II)- At the end of the second phase of the Vietnamese withdrawal:
  - simultaneous dismantling of the Phnom Penh regime and the State of Democratic Kampuchea.
  - formation of a provisional quadripartite government under the leadership of H.R.H. Samdech NORODOM Sihanouk.
- (III)- The provisional quadripartite government will be entrusted with the task of organizing free, direct and general elections, under international supervision, of a constituent assembly which will endow the country with her State constitution. The State constitution will determine the name of the State, the national flag and anthem, and the political regime as well as the administrative, judiciary, economic, financial, social, cultural, educational and press system of the country.

II

SCENARIO OF  
THE JAKARTA INFORMAL MEETING

It is the wish of the Coalition Government of Democratic Kampuchea to have Vietnam join in the proposed Jakarta informal meeting as soon as possible, preferably the same day as promised by Mr. Nguyen Co Thach, to start the talks with H.R.H. Samdech NORODOM Sihanouk and the Coalition Government of Democratic Kampuchea aimed at putting an end to the war in Kampuchea through the complete withdrawal of foreign troops from Kampuchea so as to enable the people of Kampuchea to exercise their right to self-determination and to achieve the national reconciliation among all Kampucheans, and Kampuchea to become independent and neutral within her territorial integrity, free from any foreign military base.

III

INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE TO  
GUARANTEE THE AGREEMENT ON KAMPUCHEA

Once an agreement is reached, concerned countries, the five permanent members of the United Nations Security Council and the Secretary-General of the United Nations will participate in an international conference to guarantee the arising agreement and the independence, neutrality and territorial integrity of Kampuchea.
