

Summary statement by the Secretary-General on matters of which the Security Council is seized and on the stage reached in their consideration

Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The list of items of which the Security Council is seized is contained in documents S/2000/40 of 15 February 2000, S/2000/40/Add.1 of 21 February 2000, S/2000/40/Add.5 of 28 March 2000, S/2000/40/Add.8 of 14 April 2000, S/2000/40/Add.9 of 19 April 2000, S/2000/40/Add.15 of 23 May 2000 and S/2000/40/Add.28 of 31 July 2000.

During the week ending 12 August 2000, the Security Council took action on the following item:

Children and armed conflict (*see* S/1998/44/Add.26; S/1999/25/Add.33, and S/2000/40/Add.29)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 4185th meeting, held on 11 August 2000 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations, having before it the report of the Secretary-General to the Security Council on the implementation of resolution 1261 (1999) on children and armed conflict (S/2000/712).

The President drew attention to the text of a draft resolution (S/2000/787) that had been prepared in the course of the Council's prior consultations.

The Security Council proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/2000/787, and adopted it unanimously as resolution 1314 (2000) (for the text, see S/RES/1314 (2000); to be issued in *Official Records of the Security Council, Fifty-fifth Year, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 2000*).
