Summary statement by the Secretary-General on matters of which the Security Council is seized and on the stage reached in their consideration

Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

During the week ending 17 June 2000, the Security Council took action on the following items:

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 4154th meeting, held on 13 June 2000 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations, having before it the report of the Secretary-General on the United Nations Mission in Bosnia and Herzegovina (S/2000/529).

In accordance with the understanding reached in the Council's prior consultations, the President, with the consent of the Council, extended an invitation under rule 39 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure to Mr. Jacques Paul



Klein, Special Representative of the Secretary-General and Coordinator of United Nations Operations in Bosnia and Herzegovina.

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 4155th meeting, held on 14 June 2000 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations, having before it the report of the Secretary-General on the United Nations operation in Cyprus (S/2000/496 and Corr.1).

The President drew attention to a draft resolution (S/2000/549) that had been prepared in the course of the Council's prior consultations.

The Security Council proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/2000/549, and adopted it unanimously as resolution 1303 (2000) (for the text, see S/RES/1303 (2000); to be issued in *Official Records of the Security Council, Fifty-fifth Year, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 2000*).

The situation concerning the Democratic Republic of the Congo (*see* S/1997/40/Add.21; S/1998/44/Add.35 and 49; S/1999/25/Add.10, 13, 24, 30, 43, 47 and 49; and S/2000/40/Add.3, 7, 16, 17, 19 and 21; *see also* S/1996/15/Add.43-45; S/1997/40/Add.5, 7, 9, 13, 16 and 17; S/1998/44/Add.28)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 4156th, 4157th (private), 4158th (private) and 4159th meetings, held on 15 and 16 June 2000, in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations.

At the 4156th meeting, held on 15 June 2000, the President, with the consent of the Council, invited the Special Envoy of the President of the People's Democratic Republic of Algeria, current Chairman of the Organization of African Unity, the Vice-Minister for External Relations of Angola, the Minister of State for Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation of the Democratic Republic of the Congo, the Minister for Foreign Affairs and Regional Cooperation of Rwanda, the Minister of State for Foreign Affairs and for Regional Cooperation of Uganda, Chairman of the Political Committee, the Minister for Presidential Affairs of Zambia and the Permanent Secretary in the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Zimbabwe, to participate in the meeting.

The President, with the consent of the Council, extended an invitation under rule 39 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure to Mr. Dominique Kanku, Head of External Relations of the Movement for the Liberation of the Congo

(MLC),* Professor Claver Pashi, head of the delegation of the RCD-ML, and Mr. Kamel Morjane, Special Representative of the Secretary-General for the Democratic Republic of the Congo.

At the close of the 4157th meeting, held in private on the same date, the following communiqué was issued by the Secretary-General in accordance with rule 55 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Council:

"At its 4157th meeting, held in private on 15 June 2000 at 3 p.m., the Security Council considered the situation concerning the Democratic Republic of the Congo.

"The President extended invitations in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Charter and rules 37 and 39 of its provisional rules of procedure, as appropriate, to the members of the Political Committee for the Implementation of the Lusaka Ceasefire Agreement, as well as Zambia, the representative of the current Chairman of the Organization of African Unity and the Special Representative of the Secretary-General for the Democratic Republic of the Congo.

"The members of the Council and the members of the Political Committee had a frank and constructive discussion."

At the close of the 4158th meeting, held in private on 16 June 2000, the following communiqué was issued by the Secretary-General in accordance with rule 55 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Council:

"At its 4158th meeting, held in private on 16 June 2000 at 5.30 p.m., the Security Council continued its consideration of the situation concerning the Democratic Republic of the Congo.

"The President extended invitations in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Charter and rules 37 and 39 of its provisional rules of procedure, as appropriate, to the members of the Political Committee for the Implementation of the Lusaka Ceasefire Agreement, as well as Zambia, the representative of the current Chairman of the Organization of African Unity and the Special Representative of the Secretary-General for the Democratic Republic of the Congo.

"The members of the Council and the members of the Political Committee continued their frank and constructive discussion."

At the 4159th meeting, held on the same date, the President, in accordance with the decisions taken at the 4156th and 4157th meetings, extended invitations under the relevant provisions of the Charter and rules 37 and 39 of its provisional rules of procedure, as appropriate, to the members of the Political Committee for the Implementation of the Lusaka Ceasefire Agreement, as well as Zambia, the representative of the Current Chairman of the Organization of African Unity and the Special Representative of the Secretary-General for the Democratic Republic of the Congo.

The President drew attention to a draft resolution (S/2000/587), that had been prepared in the course of the Council's prior consultations.

The Security Council proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/2000/587, and adopted it unanimously as resolution 1304 (2000) (for the text, see S/RES/1304 (2000); to be issued in *Official Records of the Security Council, Fifty-fifth Year, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 2000*).
