Addendum

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1. Further to his report to the Commission circulated as document E/CN.4/1983/31; the Secretary-General wishes to inform the Commission that the proposal introduced hereunder has been received from the Government of Uganda in regard to the implementation of Commission resolution 1982/37 and Economic and Social Council decision 1982/139 on United Nations assistance in the field of human rights.

Project

Requirements

- (i) Library for the Ministry of Justice and the High Court
- (a) Employment of one Expert Law Librarian for a period of two years.
- (b) Advanced professional training for two serving L w Librarians.
- (c) Recruitment and training of four Law Librarians.
- (d) Training of four Legal Executives to assist State Attorneys and Judges.
- (e) Provision of books, Law Reports and other legal materials.
- (ii) Revision of Laws of Uganda
- (a) Employment of one Expert for the post of Commissioner for Law Revision for a period of two years.
- (b) Employment of one Expert for the post of First Parliamentary Counsel
- (c) Training of six Ugandan State Attorneys in Parlismentary and general legal draftsmanship.
- (d) Printing of consolidated volumes of the revised laws.
- (iii) Training of prison officers

Fellowships for the training of 10 medium-cadre Prison Officers in the fields of Criminology, Penology and Treatment of Offenders.

- (iv) Training of Police Officers
- (c) Training of 12 Police Officers in the field of Scientific Investigation in particular Forensic Science.
- (b) Training of 12 Police Officers in the field of Crime Prevention and Criminal Justice.
- (c) Training of six Police Staff Officers in Public Administration.
- 2. These proposals are now being examined in consultation with all the parties concerned, including UNDP, UNESCO and the Centre for Social Development and Humanitarian Affairs.
- 3. The Commission will be kept informed of the development of these projects.
