Letter dated 24 January 2001 from the Chargé d'affaires a.i. of the Permanent Mission of Iraq to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General

On instructions from my Government, I have the honour to transmit to you herewith a letter dated 23 January 2001 from Mr. Mohammed Said Al-Sahaf, Minister for Foreign Affairs of Iraq. Appended to the Minister's letter are a number of tables showing violations of Iraq's international boundaries committed by United States and British warplanes flying across the demilitarized zone monitored by the United Nations Iraq-Kuwait Observation Mission (UNIKOM).

The Minister urges you to secure the necessary technical systems to enable UNIKOM to perform its functions in the manner required by its mandate under the relevant Security Council resolutions and to track and identify each violation and encroachment. These violations constitute wanton aggression against Iraq and against its people, its sovereignty and its territory, and they are incompatible with the relevant Security Council resolutions, the Charter of the United Nations and the norms of international law.

I should be grateful if you would have the present letter and its annex circulated as a document of the Security Council.

Annex to the letter dated 24 January 2001 from the Chargé d'affaires a.i. of the Permanent Mission of Iraq to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General

Further to my letter dated 25 December 2000 addressed to you (S/2000/1242, annex), I should like to inform you that United States and British warplanes have committed 7,824 violations of Iraq's international boundaries by way of the demilitarized zone monitored by the United Nations Iraq-Kuwait Observation Mission (UNIKOM). As shown in the tables appended to this letter, the relevant Iraqi authorities have established the facts set forth hereunder with regard to the violations committed in the period from 17 December 1998 to 31 December 2000.

- 1. Armed and hostile aerial activity by the United States and the United Kingdom, violating our international boundaries from the demilitarized zone, comprised 7,824 sorties over Iraq's southern governorates (Basrah, Amarah, Nasiriyah, Diwaniyah, Samawah, Najaf and Wasit).
- 2. Our technical systems identified the aircraft violating Iraq's airspace on an almost daily basis as American F-14s, F-15s, F-16s and F-18s and British Tornadoes.
- 3. All of the armed and hostile sorties that violated Iraq's airspace from the demilitarized zone were supported by AWACS aircraft operating inside Saudi Arabian airspace and E-2C aircraft operating inside Kuwaiti airspace.
- 4. A total of 12 remotely piloted aircraft violated Iraq's airspace from Kuwait by way of the demilitarized zone.
- 5. On 17, 18, 19 and 20 December 2000, United States and British forces launched 456 cruise missiles against Iraqi territory across the demilitarized zone.

All of the violations in question were committed from the area in which UNIKOM is stationed. UNIKOM has the responsibility of monitoring such hostile military operations and reporting them immediately or, at the very least, including information in their regard in the periodic reports that it submits to you and thence to the Security Council for purposes of documentation. The members of the Council and the international community in general may thus be informed of such violations and military encroachments committed by the United States and the United Kingdom and act to take appropriate measures to halt them.

The statements of UNIKOM to the effect that it is unable to monitor or identify these aircraft cannot be maintained in the light of the scientific and technological capabilities available, and UNIKOM is in a position to obtain and utilize them to fulfil the requirements of its mandate by establishing the identity and country of the warplanes that are violating Iraq's airspace.

I accordingly urge you to secure the systems that will allow UNIKOM to perform its functions in the manner required by its mandate under the relevant Security Council resolutions by identifying each violation and encroachment. These

violations constitute wanton aggression against Iraq and against its people, its sovereignty and its territory, and they are incompatible with the relevant Security Council resolutions, the Charter of the United Nations and the norms of international law.
