Letter dated 8 August 1988 from the Chargé d'affaires a.i. of the  
Permanent Mission of Pakistan to the United Nations addressed to  
the Secretary-General

Further to our letter dated 3 August 1988 (A/43/503-S/20087) I have the honour to report to you the following incident in violation of Pakistan territory from the Afghanistan side, which occurred on 4 August 1988:

On 4 August 1988, at 0050 hours, three Afghan fighter aircraft violated Pakistan's airspace by approximately 50 kilometers and dropped seven bombs in the Razmak area of North Waziristan Agency. As a result, four Afghan refugees were killed and three tents were burnt.

The Afghan Chargé d'affaires was summoned to the Foreign Office at Islamabad on the morning of 8 August 1988, and a strong protest was lodged with him over the unprovoked attacks. He was asked to inform the authorities in Kabul that if such attacks did not cease the entire responsibility for the serious consequences would rest on them.

I request to have this letter circulated as a document of the General Assembly, under items 30, 72, 130, 134 and 137 of the provisional agenda, and of the Security Council.
