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INTRODUCTION

- 1. The provisional agenda and time schedule for the fifth session of the Committee for Trade, Industry and Enterprise Development have been drawn up by the secretariat in consultation with the Bureau on the basis of the decisions and programme of work adopted by the Committee at its fourth session.
- 2. At its last session, the Committee decided to hold this year's Forum on the subject of Trading into the Future: e-Services for Trade, Investment and Enterprise". A preliminary agenda for this event is attached as annex I. The first two days of the Committee session will be dedicated to the Forum and the subsequent two and a half days to the regular session.
- 3. The Committee's regular session will, therefore, formally begin on Wednesday, 13 June at 10:00. The Committee will approve the draft report of this year's session on the afternoon of Friday, 15 June.

ANNOTATIONS

Item 1 - Adoption of the agenda

4. In accordance with the Commission's rules of procedure, the first item on the provisional agenda is the adoption of the agenda (ECE/TRADE/269).

Item 2 - Election of officers

5. At its third session, the Committee elected Mr. Miguel Vilchez-Barros (Spain) as Chair, and Mr. Alexander Safarik-Pstrosz (Czech Republic) and Ms. Ayse Öktem (Turkey) as its vice-chairs.

<u>Item 3 - Matters arising from the fifty-sixth session of the Economic Commission for Europe</u>

6. The secretariat will report orally on the discussions held, and the decisions adopted by the Commission at its fifty-sixth session in May 2001. If necessary, extracts from the report of that session will be made available as an informal paper (TRADE/2001/Informal/1).

POLICY SEGMENT

<u>Item 4 – Roundtable on services in transition economies</u>

7. The discussion will draw upon presentations by two or three internationally recognized experts on this topic, a background paper prepared by the secretariat (TRADE/2001/1 and Add.1), and the discussions held during the Forum.

<u>Item 5 – Recommendations from the Forum on "Trading into the Future: e-Services for Trade, Investment and Enterprise"</u>

8. Under this agenda item, the Chairman of the Forum will report on the discussions held and the conclusions drawn by the Forum (TRADE/2001/Informal/2). The Committee will then review, amend and/or approve, as appropriate, those conclusions. For information, the Committee will also have before it the Proceedings of the 2000 Forum on Electronic Commerce for Transition Countries in the Digital Age (ECE/TRADE/268).

Item 6 - Review of recent and prospective trade trends, policies and problems

9. The secretariat will introduce the latest edition of the <u>Economic Survey of Europe</u>, which reviews current economic developments in the region.

A short presentation will be given on topics highlighted in the Economic Survey of Europe

<u>Item 7 - Role and strategic direction of the Committee</u>

10. The Committee will have before it document TRADE/2001/2 containing the results of the work on role and strategic directions undertaken by the "extended Bureau" established at the last session (see ECE/TRADE/262). This document contains revised terms of reference for the Committee, which are for **approval**, as well as proposals for policy objectives and strategic goals, which are **for discussion and approval**.

REPORTS OF THE SUBSIDIARY BODIES

11. The Committee will have before it the report of the seventh session of the Centre for Trade Facilitation and Electronic Business, UN/CEFACT (TRADE/CEFACT/2001/35) and a note by the secretariat (TRADE/2001/3) summarizing decisions to be taken and progress achieved.

Item 9 - Agricultural quality standards

12. The Committee will have before it the report of the fifty-sixth session of the Working Party on Standardization of Perishable Produce and Quality Development (WP.7) (TRADE/WP.7/2000/11) and a note by the secretariat (TRADE/2001/4) summarizing decisions to be taken and progress achieved.

Item 10 - Standardization policies

13. The Committee will have before it the report of the tenth session of the Working Party on Technical Harmonization and Standardization Policies (WP.6) (TRADE/WP.6/2000/20) and a note by the secretariat (TRADE/2001/5) summarizing progress achieved and any decisions to be approved by the Committee.

14. The Committee will have before it the report of the forty-eighth session of the Working Party on International Legal and Commercial Practice, WP.5, (TRADE/WP.5/2000/11) and a note by the secretariat (TRADE/2001/6) summarizing progress achieved and any decisions to be approved by the Committee. The Committee, specifically, will be asked to **approve renewal** of the mandates of selected WP.5 subgroups.

15. The Committee will have before it the reports of the first and second sessions of the Working Party on Industry and Enterprise Development (TRADE/WP.8/2000/12 and TRADE/WP.8/2001/5). It will also have a note by the secretariat (TRADE/2001/7) reporting on the migration of activities from the Groups of Experts on the Chemical and Steel Industries to WP.8 and summarizing progress achieved and any decisions to be approved by the Committee.

FORUM ON TRADING INTO THE FUTURE: E-SERVICES FOR TRADE, INVESTMENT AND ENTERPRISE

11-12 June 2001

Background

The dynamic development of the service sector is a high priority for all countries in central and eastern Europe. The service sector is the key to promoting restructuring of industry and stimulating enterprises and entrepreneurship in countries which are in transition to market economies.

Moreover, the development of services in the modern economy directly contributes to the transition process and encourages employment creation. Recognizing the importance of these issues, the United Nations Economic Commission for Europe (UN/ECE) has decided to hold an international forum on the implications of service development for trade, investment and enterprise and particularly those services that can be delivered electronically.

Further, in cooperation with the International Trade Centre (ITC), a one-day practical workshop, offering modern techniques for successfully exporting services will be held in parallel on 12 June 2001. International experts will offer useful strategies and advice to leading entrepreneurs and representatives of transition economies on all facets of service marketing and exporting.

Objective

The Forum is expected to:

- Recommend a practical two-year United Nations initiative to promote trade in e-services in transition economies focused on preparing recommendations for action by Governments and enterprises;
- Contribute to the commitment of Governments to develop a business dialogue with the private sector:
- Endorse UN/ECE policy recommendations on best practices to stimulate the service sector.


