**Elections, nominations and confirmations****Election of two members of the International Narcotics Control Board under the provisions of article 9, paragraph 1 (a), of the Single Convention on Narcotic Drugs, 1961, as amended by the 1972 Protocol****Note by the Secretary-General****Addendum****Election of two members of the International Narcotics Control Board from among candidates nominated by the World Health Organization**

1. The present note contains information on candidates nominated by the World Health Organization (WHO). Information on candidates nominated by Governments is contained in document E/2001/L.2/Add.2.
2. In accordance with established procedure, the Secretary-General invited the Director-General of WHO to propose candidates with a view to filling the posts that would become vacant on 1 March 2002 on the expiration of the term of office of the members of the International Narcotics Control Board who had originally been nominated by WHO in 1995 and elected by the Economic and Social Council in 1996. The posts are currently occupied by Ms. Nelia Cortés-Maramba (Philippines) and Mr. Hamid A. Ghodse (Islamic Republic of Iran).
3. The Secretariat received a communication from the Director-General of WHO, dated 10 October 2000, in which, in accordance with the provisions of article 10, paragraph 1, of the Single Convention on Narcotic Drugs of 1961,<sup>1</sup> as amended by the 1972 Protocol,<sup>2</sup> the Director-General nominated the following candidates for election to the International Narcotics Control Board:

Usoa E. **Busto** (Canada/Chile)

Elisaldo **Carlini** (Brazil)

Nelia **Cortés-Maramba** (Philippines)



Hamid A. **Ghodse** (Islamic Republic of Iran)

Inayat **Khan** (Pakistan)

The biographical information of these five candidates is contained in the annex below.

### **Biographical information on candidates for election to the International Narcotics Control Board**

#### **Usoa E. Busto (Canada/Chile)**

*Date of birth:* 1946

*Education:* Bachelor of Science (B.Sc.) in mathematics (1968); Doctor of Pharmacy (Pharm.D.), University of Chile (1973).

*Present post:* Senior Scientist, Centre for Addiction and Mental Health; Professor, Faculty of Pharmacy, and Departments of Psychiatry and Pharmacology, University of Toronto.

*Previous posts:* Head of Pharmacy, Addiction Research Foundation.

*Publications:* Several in the area of benzodiazepines and oral opioid use, abuse, dependence and behavioural toxicity of these drugs. Has also worked on the influence of different risk factors (kinetics, availability, genetics, and co-morbidity with mental disorders) that influence substance use disorder.

*Honours:* Mitchell B. Balter Award for outstanding contribution to pharmacoepidemiology on the influence of availability on benzodiazepine dependence, United States of America (1996); Clinical Pharmacology Award from the Canadian Society for Clinical Pharmacology for her work on benzodiazepine withdrawal (1987); member of the World Health Organization (WHO) Expert Committee for the Eighth Review on the Convention on Psychotropic Substances in 1983 and Chairperson, WHO/Pan American Health Organization (PAHO)/Drug Enforcement Administration meeting on the Development of Strategies and Procedures for the Pre-review of Psychoactive Substances, Washington, D.C. efforts to increase the traffic safety in respect of use of drugs and driving; and WHO and the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) assisting Pakistan in promoting rational use of narcotic and psychotropic drugs and other pharmaceuticals. Visited China twice to participate in the celebration of eightieth anniversary of Beijing Medical University and to lecture at four medical institutions.
