POLICIES OF APARTHEID OF THE GOVERNMENT OF SOUTH AFRICA

DEVELOPMENT AND STRENGTHENING OF GOOD-NEIGHBOURLINESS BETWEEN STATES

Letter dated 9 December 1982 from the Permanent Representative of Mozambique to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General

Pursuant to my letter dated 24 November 1982 and published as an official document of the General Assembly and the Security Council (A/37/644-S/15501), I have the honour to inform that, at 800 hours on 6 December 1982, a South African force invaded Mozambican territory in the region of Mapulanguene, Maputo. The invading force entered about nine kilometres into Mozambican territory and wounded 16 persons - men, women and children - and destroyed three tractors owned by a cattle-breeding enterprise of Mapulanguene.

At the request of my Government, I would be grateful if you would have this information circulated as an official document of the General Assembly under the items entitled "Policies of apartheid of the Government of South Africa" and "Development and strengthening of good-neighbourliness between States".
