Summary statement by the Secretary-General on matters of which the Security Council is seized and on the stage reached in their consideration

Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The list of items of which the Security Council is seized is contained in documents S/2001/15 of 19 March 2001, S/2001/15/Add.3 of 28 March 2001, S/2001/15/Add.5 of 2 April 2001, S/2001/15/Add.6 of 4 April 2001, S/2001/15/Add.7 of 6 April 2001, S/2001/15/Add.10 of 13 April 2001, S/2001/15/Add.20 of 25 May 2001 and S/2001/15/Add.22 of 8 June 2001.

During the week ending 9 June 2001, the Security Council took action on the following item:

The situation in Afghanistan (*see* S/1994/20/Add.3, 11, 31 and 47; S/1996/15/Add.6, 14, 38, 41 and 42; S/1997/40/Add.15, 27 and 50; S/1998/44/Add.14, 28, 31, 34, 37 and 49; S/1999/25/Add.33, 40 and 41; and S/2000/40/Add. 13 and 50; *see also* S/19420/Add.44; S/20370/Add.14-16; and S/21100/15/Add.1)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 4325th meeting, held on 5 June 2001 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations, having before it the letter dated 21 May 2001 from the Secretary-General addressed to the President of the Security Council (S/2001/511). There was one suspension and one resumption of the meeting.

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Afghanistan, the Islamic Republic of Iran, Pakistan and Uzbekistan, at their request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

In accordance with the understanding reached in the Council's prior consultations, the President, with the consent of the Council, extended invitations under rule 39 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure to Haile Menkerios, Chairman of the Committee of Experts on Afghanistan appointed pursuant to Security Council resolution 1333 (2000), and to Alfonso Valdivieso, Chairman of the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 1267 (1999) concerning Afghanistan.
