REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON THE ADMISSION OF NEW MEMBERS CONCERNING THE APPLICATION OF PAPUA NEW GUINEA FOR MEMBERSHIP IN THE UNITED NATIONS

- 1. At the 1839th meeting on 22 September 1975, the Security Council had before it the application of Papua New Guinea (S/11823) for admission to membership in the United Nations. In accordance with rule 59 of the provisional rules of procedure, the President of the Security Council referred the application to the Committee for examination and report.
- 2. At its 50th meeting, held on 22 September 1975, the Committee considered the application of Papua New Guinea and unanimously decided to recommend to the Security Council that it should be admitted to membership in the United Nations.
- 3. The Committee further decided to recommend to the Security Council that it should have recourse to the provisions of the last paragraph of rule 60 of the provisional rules of procedure.
- 4. Accordingly, the Committee decided to recommend to the Security Council the adoption of the following draft resolution:

The Security Council,

Having examined the application of Papua New Guinea for admission to the United Nations (S/11823),

Recommends to the General Assembly that Papua New Guinea be admitted to membership in the United Nations.
