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## NOTE

The resolutions and decisions of the General Assembly are identified as follows:

### Regular sessions

Until the thirtieth regular session, the resolutions of the General Assembly were identified by an arabic numeral followed by a roman numeral in parentheses indicating the session (for example: resolution 3363 (XXX)). When several resolutions were adopted under the same number, each of them was identified by a capital letter placed between the two numerals (for example: resolution 3367 A (XXX), resolutions 3411 A and B (XXX), resolutions 3419 A to D (XXX)). The decisions were not numbered.

Since the thirty-first session, as part of the new system adopted for symbols of General Assembly documents, resolutions and decisions have been identified by an arabic numeral, indicating the session, followed by an oblique stroke and another arabic numeral (for example: resolution 31/1, decision 31/301). When several resolutions or decisions were adopted under the same number, each of them has been identified by a capital letter placed after the two numerals (for example: resolution 31/16 A, resolutions 31/6 A and B, decisions 31/406 A to E).

### Special sessions

Until the seventh special session, the resolutions of the General Assembly were identified by an arabic numeral followed, in parentheses, by the letter "S" and a roman numeral indicating the session (for example: resolution 3362 (S-VII)). The decisions were not numbered.

Since the eighth special session, resolutions and decisions have been identified by the letter "S" and an arabic numeral indicating the session, followed by an oblique stroke and another arabic numeral (for example: resolution S-8/1, decision S-8/11).

### Emergency special sessions

Until the fifth emergency special session, the resolutions of the General Assembly were identified by an arabic numeral followed, in parentheses, by the letters "ES" and a roman numeral indicating the session (for example: resolution 2252 (ES-V)). The decisions were not numbered.

Since the sixth emergency special session, resolutions and decisions have been identified by the letters "ES" and an arabic numeral indicating the session, followed by an oblique stroke and another arabic numeral (for example: resolution ES-6/1, decision ES-6/11).

In each of the series described above, the numbering follows the order of adoption.

At its 69th plenary meeting, on 20 November 2000, the General Assembly, on the recommendation of the First Committee,<sup>38</sup> and recalling its resolutions 50/70 B of 12 December 1995, 52/38 J of 9 December 1997, 53/77 E of 4 December 1998 and 54/54 V of 15 December 1999 decided:

(a) To convene the United Nations Conference on the Illicit Trade in Small Arms and Light Weapons in All Its Aspects, in New York, from 9 to 20 July 2001;

(b) To convene the third session of the Preparatory Committee for the Conference, in New York, from 19 to 30 March 2001;

(c) To include in the provisional agenda of its fifty-sixth session the item entitled "Small arms".

"1. The General Assembly, having considered the chapter of the report of the Special Committee on the Situation with regard to the Implementation of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples relating to an item on the agenda of the Special Committee entitled 'Military activities and arrangements by colonial Powers in Territories under their administration',<sup>42</sup> and recalling its resolution 1514 (XV) of 14 December 1960 and all other relevant resolutions and decisions of the United Nations relating to military activities in colonial and Non-Self-Governing Territories, reaffirms its strong conviction that military bases and installations in the Territories concerned could constitute an obstacle to the exercise by the people of those

Territories of their right to self-determination, and reiterates its strong views that existing bases and installations, which are impeding the implementation of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples, should be withdrawn.

"2. Aware of the presence of such bases and installations in some of those Territories, the General Assembly urges the administering Powers concerned to continue to take all necessary measures not to involve those Territories in any offensive acts or interference against other States.

"3. The General Assembly reiterates its concern that military activities and arrangements by colonial Powers in Territories under their administration might run counter to the rights and interests of the colonial peoples concerned, especially their right to self-determination and independence. The Assembly once again calls upon the administering Powers concerned to terminate such activities and to eliminate such military bases in compliance with its relevant resolutions. Alternative sources of livelihood for the peoples of the Non-Self-Governing Territories should be provided.

"4. The General Assembly reiterates that the colonial and Non-Self-Governing Territories and areas adjacent thereto should not be used for nuclear testing, dumping of nuclear wastes or deployment of nuclear or other weapons of mass destruction.

"5. The General Assembly deplores the continued alienation of land in colonial and Non-Self-Governing Territories, particularly in the small island Territories of the Pacific and Caribbean regions, for military installations. The large-scale utilization of local resources for this purpose could adversely affect the economic development of the Territories concerned.

"6. The General Assembly takes note of the decision of some of the administering Powers to close or downsize some of those military bases in the Non-Self-Governing Territories.

"7. The General Assembly requests the Secretary-General to continue to inform world public opinion of those military activities and arrangements in colonial and Non-Self-Governing Territories which constitute an obstacle to the implementation of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples.

"8. The General Assembly requests the Special Committee on the Situation with regard to the Implementation of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples to continue to examine this question and to report thereon to the Assembly at its fifty-sixth session."

#### 55/427. Question of Gibraltar

At its 83rd plenary meeting, on 8 December 2000, the General Assembly, on the recommendation of the Special Political and Decolonization Committee (Fourth Committee),<sup>43</sup> adopted the following text:

"The General Assembly, recalling its decision 54/423 of 6 December 1999, and recalling at the same time that the statement agreed to by the Governments of Spain and the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland at Brussels on 27 November 1984<sup>44</sup> stipulates, *inter alia*, the following:

"The establishment of a negotiating process aimed at overcoming all the differences between them over Gibraltar and at promoting cooperation on a mutually beneficial basis on economic, cultural, touristic, aviation, military and environmental matters. Both sides accept that the issues of sovereignty will be discussed in that process. The British Government will fully maintain its commitment to honour the wishes of the people of Gibraltar as set out in the preamble of the 1969 Constitution",

takes note of the fact that, as part of this process, the Ministers for Foreign Affairs of Spain and the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland hold annual meetings alternately in each capital, the most recent of which was held in London on 10 December 1997, and urges both Governments to continue their negotiations with the object of reaching a definitive solution to the problem of Gibraltar in the light of relevant resolutions of the General Assembly and in the spirit of the Charter of the United Nations."

**55/423. Organization of work of the Third Committee and biennial programme of work of the Committee for 2001–2002**

At its 81st plenary meeting, on 4 December 2000, the General Assembly, on the recommendation of the Third Committee,<sup>97</sup> and pursuant to its resolutions 45/175 of 18 December 1990, 46/140 of 17 December 1991 and 50/227 of 24 May 1996, approved the organization of work of the Third Committee and the biennial programme of work of the Committee for 2001–2002, as contained in annexes I and II to the present decision.

**Annex I**

**Organization of work of the Third Committee**

**A. Guidelines concerning time limits of statements**

1. In accordance with rule 106 of the rules of procedure of the General Assembly and paragraph 22 of Assembly decision 34/401 on the rationalization of the procedures and organization of the Assembly, at the beginning of each session, the Chairman of the Third Committee should propose to the Committee the limitation of the time to be allowed speakers.

2. Further to General Assembly resolutions 45/175 of 18 December 1990 and 46/140 of 17 December 1991, on the rationalization of the work of the Third Committee, statements made by delegations and by Secretariat officials, unless decided otherwise by the Committee at the beginning of the session, should not exceed seven minutes. Statements made on behalf of a group of delegations or made in connection with the sub-items of the agenda item on human rights questions should not exceed fifteen minutes. These time limits will be applied with a degree of flexibility towards all speakers. With a view to saving time, all speakers are encouraged to exercise self-discipline, in particular delegations associated with group statements. For practical reasons, group statements are encouraged for the first day of the discussion of an item or a sub-item. In this connection, it is important to emphasize the timely distribution of documentation in accordance with the rules of procedure of the General Assembly, in order to enable delegations to inscribe themselves on the list of speakers at an early stage.

**B. Draft resolutions on reports of treaty bodies and reports of the Secretary-General on the status of the treaties**

3. Reports of all treaty bodies will be submitted to the General Assembly in accordance with the respective legislative mandates of those bodies. Substantive resolutions on those

reports should be adopted biennially, in accordance with the programme of work of the Third Committee. It is recommended that, where possible, draft resolutions on the status of the treaties should not be submitted separately but should be incorporated in the draft resolution relating to the report of the treaty body. In alternate years, the Committee should simply take note of the reports unless more substantive action is deemed appropriate.

**C. Proposals emanating from subsidiary organs of the Economic and Social Council**

4. The Economic and Social Council, in transmitting proposals to the General Assembly, should, to the extent possible, bear in mind the programme of work of the Third Committee.

**D. Programme of work**

5. An informal meeting of the Third Committee should be held immediately after the election of the members of its Bureau in order to consider the programme of work of the Committee based on a draft to be prepared by the Secretariat and to consider other organizational aspects relating to the work of the Committee, especially the status of documentation.

6. The items allocated to the Third Committee for consideration during the fifty-sixth session of the General Assembly should be taken up in the following order:

- Item 2. Social development, including questions relating to the world social situation and to youth, ageing, disabled persons and the family
- Item 3. Follow-up to the International Year of Older Persons: Second World Assembly on Ageing
- Item 4. Crime prevention and criminal justice
- Item 5. International drug control
- Item 6. Advancement of women
- Item 7. Implementation of the outcome of the Fourth World Conference on Women and of the special session of the General Assembly entitled "Women 2000: gender equality, development and peace for the twenty-first century"
- Item 8. Report of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees, questions relating to refugees, returnees and displaced persons and humanitarian questions
- Item 9. Promotion and protection of the rights of children
- Item 10. Programme of activities of the International Decade of the World's Indigenous People

(a) Noted that the adoption of draft resolution VI, contained in paragraph 35 of the report of the Third Committee,<sup>115</sup> would give rise to additional requirements up to 800,000 United States dollars under section 9, Economic and Social affairs, of the programme budget for the biennium 2000–2001,<sup>116</sup> on the understanding that the provision of regular budget funds to the International Research and Training Institute for the Advancement of Women would constitute a one-time exception to the provisions of article VI, paragraph 1, of the statute of the Institute;<sup>117</sup>

(b) Decided, in this connection, to advance the Institute up to 800,000 dollars for 2001 pending receipt of voluntary contributions on a one-time, exceptional and emergency basis;

(c) Also decided that, if voluntary contributions were insufficient to meet the Institute's requirements for 2001, this advance, less voluntary contributions received, would be considered a one-time only subvention and that the resources utilized under the terms of this subvention would be reported in the context of the second performance report on the programme budget for the biennium 2000–2001;

(d) Emphasized the need for the Institute, as a voluntarily financed programme of the United Nations, to

pursue, as a priority activity, the expansion of its donor base, in accordance with the provisions of article VI, paragraph 1, of its own statute.

**7. Decisions adopted on the reports of the Sixth Committee**

**55/428. Progressive development of the principles and norms of international law relating to the new international economic order**

At its 84th plenary meeting, on 12 December 2000, the General Assembly, on the recommendation of the Sixth Committee,<sup>118</sup> decided to resume its consideration of the legal aspects of international economic relations at its fifty-eighth session and to include in the provisional agenda of that session the item entitled "Progressive development of the principles and norms of international law relating to the new international economic order".

**55/429. Observer status for the International Institute for Democracy and Electoral Assistance in the General Assembly**

At its 84th plenary meeting, on 12 December 2000, the General Assembly, on the recommendation of the Sixth Committee,<sup>119</sup> decided to resume its consideration of and defer a decision on the request for observer status for the International Institute for Democracy and Electoral Assistance in the General Assembly<sup>120</sup> until its fifty-sixth session.
