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Summary statement by the Secretary-General on matters of which the Security Council is seized and on the stage reached in their consideration

Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The list of items of which the Security Council is seized is contained in documents S/2001/15 of 19 March 2001, S/2001/15/Add.3 of 28 March 2001, S/2001/15/Add.5 of 2 April 2001, S/2001/15/Add.6 of 4 April 2001, S/2001/15/Add.7 of 6 April 2001, S/2001/15/Add.10 of 13 April 2001 and S/2001/15/Add.20 of 25 May 2001.

During the week ending 30 June 2001, the Security Council considered at its 4337th meeting, held in private on 27 June 2001, the question of the recommendation for the appointment of the Secretary-General of the United Nations.

In accordance with rule 55 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the following communiqué was issued through the Secretary-General in place of a verbatim record:

“At its 4337th meeting, held in private on 27 June 2001, the Security Council considered the question of the recommendation for the appointment of the Secretary-General of the United Nations.

“The Security Council adopted by acclamation the following resolution:

‘The Security Council,

‘Having considered the question of the recommendation for the appointment of the Secretary-General of the United Nations,

‘Recommends to the General Assembly that Mr. Kofi Annan be appointed Secretary-General of the United Nations for a second term of office from 1 January 2002 to 31 December 2006.’”

By a letter dated 15 June 2001 addressed to the President of the Security Council (S/2001/597), the Permanent Representative of the Russian Federation to the United Nations requested, in accordance with rule 2 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, that an open meeting be convened in order to consider “ways of improving the humanitarian situation in Iraq in the conditions of the negative effect of the sanctions on the population of that country, and also ways of implementing all the Security Council resolutions on Iraq and a post-conflict settlement in the Gulf region”.

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 4336th meeting, held on 26 and 28 June 2001 in accordance with the above request. There was one suspension and one resumption of the meeting.

On 26 June 2001, the President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Australia, Austria, Bahrain, Canada, Germany, India, Iraq, Italy, Japan, Jordan, Kuwait, the Libyan Arab Jamahiriya, Malaysia, the Netherlands, New Zealand, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, South Africa, Spain, Sweden, the Syrian Arab Republic, Thailand, Turkey and Yemen, at their request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

In response to the request contained in a letter dated 25 June 2001 from the Permanent Representative of Tunisia to the United Nations (S/2001/631), the President, with the consent of the Council, extended an invitation under rule 39 of the Council’s provisional rules of procedure to Mr. Hussein Hassouna, Permanent Observer for the League of Arab States to the United Nations.

The situation in Burundi (see S/25070/Add.43 and 46; S/1994/20/Add.29, 33, 41 and 50; S/1995/40/Add.4, 9, 12 and 34; S/1996/15 and Add.4, 9, 16, 19, 29, 30 and 34; S/1997/40/Add.21; S/1999/25/Add.44; S/2000/40/Add.2 and 38; and S/2001/15/Add.9 and 11)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 4338th meeting, held in private on 27 June 2001, and at its 4341st meeting, held on 21 June 2001 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations.

At the close of the 4338th meeting, on 27 June 2001, in accordance with rule 55 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the following communiqué was issued through the Secretary-General in place of a verbatim record:

“At its 4338th meeting, held in private on 27 June 2001, the Security Council considered the item entitled ‘The situation in Burundi’.

“The President extended an invitation in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Charter and rule 37 of the Council’s provisional rules of

procedure to His Excellency Mr. Mathias Sinamenye, second Vice-President of the Republic of Burundi.

“The Security Council heard a statement by His Excellency Mr. Sinamenye.”

At the 4341st meeting, on 21 June 2001, the President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representative of Burundi, at his request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

The President stated that, following consultations of the Council, he had been authorized to make a statement on behalf of the Council and read out the text of that statement (for the text, see S/PRST/2001/17; to be issued in *Official Records of the Security Council, Fifty-sixth Year, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 2001*).

The responsibility of the Security Council in the maintenance of international peace and security: HIV/AIDS and international peacekeeping operations

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 4339th meeting, held on 28 June 2001 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations.

In accordance with the understanding reached in the Council's prior consultations, the President, with the consent of the Council, extended an invitation under rule 39 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure to Mr. Peter Piot, Executive Director of the Joint United Nations Programme on HIV/AIDS.

The President stated that, following consultations of the Council, he had been authorized to make a statement on behalf of the Council and read out the text of that statement (for the text, see S/PRST/2001/16; to be issued in *Official Records of the Security Council, Fifty-sixth Year, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 2001*).

The situation in Sierra Leone (see S/1995/40/Add.47; S/1996/15/Add.6, 11 and 48; S/1997/40/Add.21, 27, 31, 40 and 45; S/1998/44/Add.8, 11, 15, 20, 22, 28 and 50; S/1999/25 and Add.1, 9, 18, 22, 32, 41 and 48; S/2000/40/Add.5, 10, 17, 18, 19, 24, 26, 28, 30, 32, 35, 37 and 50; and S/2001/15/Add.4 and 13)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 4340th meeting, held on 28 June 2001 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations, having before it the tenth report of the Secretary-General on the United Nations Mission in Sierra Leone (S/2001/627).

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Canada, Nigeria, Pakistan, Sierra Leone and Sweden, at their request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

In accordance with the understanding reached in the Council's prior consultations, the President, with the consent of the Council, extended an invitation under rule 39 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure to Mr. Oluyemi Adeniji, Special Representative of the Secretary-General and Head of the United Nations Mission in Sierra Leone.

The situation concerning Western Sahara (see S/11593/Add.42 and 44; S/19420/Add.38; S/21100/Add.25; S/22110/Add.17; S/23370; S/25070/Add.9; S/1994/20/Add.12, 29 and 45; S/1995/40/Add.1, 14, 20, 25, 37 and 50; S/1996/15/Add.21 and 47; S/1997/40/Add.11, 20, 39 and 42; S/1998/44/Add.4, 15, 29, 37, 43 and 50; S/1999/25/Add.3, 5, 12, 16, 18, 36 and 49; S/2000/40/Add.8, 21, 29, 42 and 43; and S/2001/15/Add.9 and 17)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 4342nd meeting, held on 29 June 2001 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations, having before it the report of the Secretary-General on the situation concerning Western Sahara (S/2001/613).

The President drew attention to a draft resolution (S/2001/641) that had been prepared in the course of the Council's prior consultations.

The Security Council proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/2001/641, and adopted it unanimously as resolution 1359 (2001) (for the text, see S/RES/1359 (2001); to be issued in *Official Records of the Security Council, Fifty-sixth Year, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 2001*).
