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**Information circular\***

Subject: **Arrangements for admission to the premises at United Nations Headquarters during the fifty-sixth session of the General Assembly**

1. The present circular describes the arrangements that will be in effect at Headquarters for admission to the premises, as well as arrangements with respect to parking, catering facilities and commercial operations, during the fifty-sixth session of the General Assembly. A separate information circular will be issued on security arrangements for admission to United Nations Headquarters that will be in effect during the 27th special session of the General Assembly, from 19 to 21 September 2001, and during the general debate, from 24 September to 5 October 2001.

**Admission to Headquarters buildings**

2. Staff members, affiliates and accredited members of non-governmental organizations and the information media will be admitted to the United Nations premises only upon presentation of a valid United Nations identification card (grounds pass) or laissez-passer. All are reminded that, in view of the need for heightened security measures, the provisions of Secretary-General's bulletin ST/SGB/259 of 2 July 1993 on the wearing of identification cards will be strictly enforced. It is the responsibility of staff members to ensure that their identification cards are current; expired cards will be replaced by the Pass and Identification Unit of the Security and Safety Service, located on the ground floor of the UNITAR Building at 45th Street and First Avenue, upon presentation of an application obtained from the staff member's Executive Office. Staff members who arrive without their grounds passes will be directed to the visitors' entrance at 46th Street, where they will be required to pass through a magnetometer. A day pass can be obtained at the information desk in the lobby of the General Assembly Building upon verification of the staff member's identity. The hours of operation of the information desk are 9 a.m. to 5.30 p.m.

### **Access through the delegates' entrance**

3. During the fifty-sixth session, the gate at 45th Street and First Avenue and the delegates' entrance will be reserved for use by members of delegations. Staff members and affiliates are requested to use other access points.

### **Pass and Identification Offices, UNITAR Building and North Lawn Facility**

4. In preparation for the special session of the General Assembly on children and in advance of the general debate of the fifty-sixth session of the Assembly, the Pass and Identification Office, located in the UNITAR Building, 801 United Nations Plaza, corner of 45th Street and First Avenue, will be open to staff members and members of delegations. Representatives of non-governmental organizations and members of the media will be assisted with accreditation at the North Lawn Facility, located at the First Avenue and 47th Street entrance. The days and hours of operation for the Pass and Identification Office at the UNITAR Building and North Lawn Facility will be as follows:

### **Access for members of non-governmental organizations**

5. All members of non-governmental organizations (NGOs) with valid United Nations grounds passes will be admitted via the visitors' entrance at 46th Street and First Avenue or at the Secretariat entrance at 42nd Street and First Avenue, where they will be required to pass through a magnetometer. During the two weeks of the general debate, from Monday, 24 September, to Friday, 5 October 2001, and thereafter whenever heightened security considerations require extra measures, the NGO doorway at 46th Street shall be the only entry point into United Nations Headquarters for members of NGOs. Members of NGOs who are accredited to the United Nations for a specific period of time may enter United Nations Headquarters only through the NGO doorway at the 46th Street entrance.

### **Access for members of the information media**

6. Members of the media with valid United Nations grounds passes may use the visitors' entrance at 46th Street and First Avenue or the entrance at 42nd Street and First Avenue, where they will be required to pass through a magnetometer. Resident correspondents without equipment are exempt from screening through metal detectors and may enter via the 42nd Street entrance. Members of the media with temporary passes may use only the 46th Street entrance.

### **Access for interns**

7. Interns with valid United Nations grounds passes will be admitted via the visitors' entrance at 46th Street and First Avenue or through the Secretariat entrance at 42nd Street and First Avenue, where they will be required to pass through a magnetometer. During the two weeks of the general debate, from Monday, 24 September, to Friday, 5 October 2001, and thereafter whenever heightened security considerations require extra measures, the entrance at 46th Street shall be the only entry point into United Nations Headquarters for interns.

### **Access to restricted areas**

8. The second floor of both the General Assembly Building and the Conference Building are reserved for members of delegations, staff conducting official business in the area and accredited members of the information media, in accordance with established procedures. In all cases, valid United Nations identification will be required.

9. Access to the second floor, including the North Lounge and the General Assembly Hall, will be permitted only upon presentation of a secondary pass for the fifty-sixth session of the General Assembly, together with a United Nations grounds pass. Secondary passes will be issued by the Pass and Identification Unit, in accordance with arrangements made by executive offices. Identification cards and secondary passes are subject to verification by security officers and must be worn in such a manner as to be easily visible.

10. The South Lounge on the second floor of the Conference Building, excluding the adjoining Security Council Lounge, is open to staff members when the Security Council is not in session.

11. To the extent that space is available, staff members, retirees, interns and members of non-governmental organizations will be accorded access to the gallery seating areas of the General Assembly Hall and conference rooms upon presentation of their grounds passes. On certain days, however, special arrangements may be in effect.

### **Admission of non-United Nations persons**

12. Staff members are reminded of the existing security arrangements, under which all visitors on official business (maximum of five) and invited guests (maximum of three), including family members, must enter through the visitors'

entrance at 46th Street and pass through a magnetometer prior to requesting admission to the Secretariat Building at the information desk. An information assistant will verify the visit with the respective staff member before a visitor's day pass is issued. Staff members must escort their visitors and guests at all times when they are in United Nations buildings. Visitors and guests, including children over the age of 17, will be required to submit a piece of personal identification bearing a photograph to the security officer stationed at the information desk. In order to avoid inconvenience, visitors and guests should be informed in advance that photo identification is required.

13. During peak periods of the General Assembly, staff members are urged to restrict visits by outside persons to those involving official business only. It will be the responsibility of each staff member to meet his or her guests, accompany them at all times and later escort them back to the public area in the General Assembly Building lobby. No guest will be permitted to enter restricted areas.

### **Tours**

14. During the period from Monday, 17 September, to Friday, 21 September 2001, regular guided tours will be suspended. Guided tours will resume for one day on Saturday, 22 September 2001, and will be suspended again from Sunday, 23 September, to Friday, 28 September. On Saturday and Sunday, 29 and 30 September, guided tours will resume and the building will be open to the public. Guided tours will be suspended again from Monday, 1 October, to Friday, 5 October. The building will reopen to the public on Saturday, 6 October 2001, and the guided tours will resume a regular daily and weekend schedule.

### **Traffic in the Secretariat Circle**

15. Vehicular access through the gate at First Avenue and 43rd Street will continue to be restricted to vehicles of the permanent representatives and observers to the United Nations; no other vehicles will be permitted access to the Secretariat Circle. However, exceptions will be made for disabled persons, upon appropriate certification by the Medical Service.

### **Parking**

16. Parking for staff members in the garage will be limited to those who possess a regular parking permit. When exigencies of service require the use of a vehicle, a limited number of temporary permits may be issued to staff members upon written justification by their Executive Office and approval by the Garage Review Board. Parking permits must be readily visible to security officers at entry points and prominently displayed while the vehicles are parked on the premises. Vehicles not displaying a valid permit may be towed off the premises for security and safety reasons. Passengers who are not in possession of valid United Nations identification must leave the vehicle before it enters the premises.

17. Vehicles other than those belonging to permanent representatives or observers to the United Nations will be required to enter the garage via the 48th Street

entrance. Vehicles may leave through the 42nd Street exit between 5 p.m. and 7 p.m. from Monday to Friday, or between 6 a.m. and 8 p.m. through the 48th Street entrance. At all other times, vehicles must exit through the main gate at 43rd Street. Traffic lanes on the service road and roadways in the garage must be kept free of stationary vehicles at all times.

18. All vehicles entering the premises are subject to search.

### **Dining room, other catering facilities and commercial operations**

19. The hours of service for the Delegates' Dining Room are 11.30 a.m. to 2.30 p.m. Staff members are encouraged to make reservations for the Delegates' Dining Room (ext. 3-7625) for 11.30 a.m., 12 noon or after 2 p.m., since the demand at 1 p.m. is usually heavy. During the general debate, access to the Delegates' Dining Room for lunch will be restricted to persons holding a valid United Nations grounds pass or laissez-passer. From 11 September to 5 October 2001, reservations for private dinners or receptions will be accepted only from permanent and observer missions and United Nations bodies. The Ex-press Bar on the third floor of the General Assembly Building may not be used for parties when the General Assembly is meeting.

20. Staff members whose lunch hour is not determined by the schedule of meetings are urged to use the cafeteria when it is least crowded, that is, before 12.15 p.m. and after 1.45 p.m. Alternative facilities in the following areas may also be used: the Staff Cafe on the fourth floor, the UNCA Club on the third floor, the Vendery on the third floor of the General Assembly Building, the coffee shop in the first basement of the General Assembly Building (visitors' area), the cafeteria on the third floor of the DC-1 Building and the cafeteria located on the first floor of UNICEF House.
