## Statement by His Excellency the Minister for Foreign Affairs of the State of Qatar, Doha, 14 September 2001 (Qatar News Agency)

His Excellency Sheikh Hamad bin Jassim bin Jabr Al-Thani, Minister for Foreign Affairs of the State of Qatar, current Chairman of the Organization of the Islamic Conference, expressed the Organization's condemnation and censure of the terrorist attacks carried out against the United States of America.

In his statement to the Qatar News Agency today, His Excellency stressed that Islam is a true religion, which denounces and rejects terrorism, repudiates violence and bloodshed and calls for the protection of human beings and non-aggression against innocent persons, and that it is the religion of tolerance and love.
