# Summary statement by the Secretary-General on matters of which the Security Council is seized and on the stage reached in their consideration

## Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The list of items of which the Security Council is seized is contained in documents S/2001/15 of 19 March 2001, S/2001/15/Add.3 of 28 March 2001, S/2001/15/Add.5 of 2 April 2001, S/2001/15/Add.6 of 4 April 2001, S/2001/15/Add.7 of 6 April 2001, S/2001/15/Add.10 of 13 April 2001, S/2001/15/Add.20 of 25 May 2001 and S/2001/15/Add.26 of 6 July 2001.

During the week ending 1 September 2001, the Security Council took action on the following items:

Security Council resolutions 1160 (1998), 1199 (1998), 1203 (1998), 1239 (1999) and 1244 (1999) (*see* S/1999/25/Add.43 and 51; S/2000/40/Add.6, 9, 18, 22, 27, 33, 38, 45, 46 and 50; and S/2001/15/Add.3, 7, 10, 11, 15, 25 and 30; *see also* S/1998/44/Add.13, 34, 38 and 42; and S/1999/25/Add.2, 3, 11, 18 and 22)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 4359th meeting, held on 28 August 2001 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations.

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Belgium, the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia and Yugoslavia, at their request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

In accordance with the understanding reached in the Council's prior consultations, the President, with the consent of the Council, extended an invitation under rule 39 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure to Jean-Marie Guéhenno, Under-Secretary-General for Peacekeeping Operations.

**Role of the Security Council in the prevention of armed conflicts** (*see* S/1999/25/Add.47; S/2000/40/Add.28; and S/2001/15/Add.25)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 4360th meeting, held on 30 August 2001 in accordance with the understanding reached in



its prior consultations, having before it the report of the Secretary-General on the prevention of armed conflict (S/2001/574 and Corr.1).

The President drew attention to a draft resolution (S/2001/828) that had been prepared in the course of the Council's prior consultations.

The Security Council proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/2001/828, and adopted it unanimously as resolution 1366 (2001) (for the text, see S/RES/1366 (2001); to be issued in *Official Records of the Security Council, Fifty-sixth Year, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 2001*).

#### The situation concerning the Democratic Republic of the Congo (see

S/1997/40/Add.21; S/1998/44/Add.35 and 49; S/1999/25/Add.10, 13, 24, 30, 43, 47 and 49; S/2000/40/Add.3, 7, 16, 17, 19, 21, 23, 30, 33, 40, 47 and 49; and S/2001/15/Add.5, 8, 18, 24 and 30; *see also* S/1996/15/Add.43-45; S/1997/40/Add.5, 7, 9, 13, 16 and 17; and S/1998/44/Add.28)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 4361st meeting, held on 30 August 2001 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations.

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Belgium, the Democratic Republic of the Congo, Namibia and Rwanda, at their request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

In accordance with the understanding reached in the Council's prior consultations, the President, with the consent of the Council, extended an invitation under rule 39 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure to Hédi Annabi, Assistant Secretary-General for Peacekeeping Operations.

### Small arms (see S/1999/25/Add.37; and S/2001/15/Add.31)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 4362nd meeting, held on 31 August 2001 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations, having before it a letter dated 25 July 2001 from the Permanent Representative of Colombia to the United Nations addressed to the President of the Security Council (S/2001/732).

The President stated that, following consultations of the Council, he had been authorized to make a statement on behalf of the Council and read out the text of that statement (for the text, see S/PRST/2001/21; to be issued in *Official Records of the Security Council, Fifty-sixth Year, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 2001*).

# **Wrap-up discussion on the work of the Security Council for the current month** (*see also* S/2001/15/Add.26)
