

Letter dated 15 October 2001 from the Permanent Representative of Iraq to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General

On instructions from my Government, I have the honour to inform you that 179 unexploded cluster bombs, missiles, other ordnance and anti-personnel and anti-tank mines left behind by the 1991 30-nation aggression against Iraq were found and rendered harmless in all parts of Iraq in the period from 1 August to 30 September 2001. They were found in the following governorates: Baghdad, Basrah, Anbar, Ninawa, Salah al-Din, Dhi Qar, Muthanna, Najaf and Wasit.

I should be grateful if you would have this letter circulated as a document of the Security Council.
