Qatar expresses concern for the fate of Arabs and persons of other nationalities in Afghanistan

The State of Qatar has expressed its deep concern at the possibility that many Arabs and persons of other nationalities in Afghanistan, and especially in the city of Kunduz, may have been massacred on the basis of their race or nationality, which would be incompatible with human values and with the principles of international humanitarian law and human rights.

The official spokesman for the Ministry of Foreign Affairs stated that, in telephone calls to Mr. Colin L. Powell, Secretary of State of the United States of America, and Mr. Amre Moussa, Secretary-General of the League of Arab States, His Excellency Sheikh Hamad Bin Jassem Bin Jabr Al Thani, Minister for Foreign Affairs, had transmitted Qatar's concern and anxiety concerning the whereabouts and safety of these persons, who must be accorded the rights guaranteed to them under the international conventions on prisoners of war.

The official spokesman appealed to the fraternal parties in Afghanistan to exercise self-restraint, to avoid bloodshed and to form a national government representing all groups and classes of the Afghan people.
