1. The General Assembly, by its resolution 32/72 of 9 December 1977, decided to retain the Committee on Conferences established under its resolution 3351 (XXIX) of 18 December 1974. The Committee's terms of reference were defined as follows:

"(a) To advise the General Assembly on the calendar of conferences;

"(b) To act on behalf of the General Assembly in dealing with departures from the approved calendar of conferences that have administrative and financial implications;

"(c) To recommend to the General Assembly means to provide the optimum apportionment of conference resources, facilities and services, including documentation, in order to ensure their most efficient and effective use;

"(d) To advise the General Assembly on the current and future requirements of the Organization for conference services, facilities and documentation;

"(e) To advise the General Assembly on means to ensure improved co-ordination of conferences within the United Nations system, including conference services and facilities, and to conduct the appropriate consultations in that regard."

2. The membership of the Committee on Conferences in 1979 remained the same as in 1978 and consisted of the following Member States:

#### CHAPTER II. ORGANIZATIONAL MATTERS

#### A. Officers

#### 3. The following officers continued to serve in 1979:

Chairman:	Mr. Michael G. Okeyo (Kenya)
Vice-Chairmen:	Mr. John H. N. Gooneratne (Sri Lanka) Mr. Miloslav Ježil (Czechoslovakia) Mr. Javier Suazo Tomé (Honduras)
Rapporteur:	Mr. Timothy J. Hannah (New Zealand)

4. Owing to the reassignment of Mr. Hannah to another post, the Committee, at its 125th meeting, elected Mr. Richard J. Martin (New Zealand) Rapporteur.

## B. Organization of work

5. The Committee agreed to meet whenever the need arose to deal with matters related to the calendar of conferences and meetings. For the consideration of various substantive questions, the Committee decided to hold a series of substantive meetings.

6. The Committee also agreed to continue taking decisions by consensus, bearing in mind the substance of the items discussed and adopting, where necessary, a pragmatic and flexible approach in order not to impede the exercise of the Committee's functions.

7. The Committee held 16 meetings between 28 December 1978 and 13 September 1979. It held six meetings during the first series of substantive meetings in the period 9 to 12 April 1979

## C. Programme of work

8. On the basis of a note by the Secretariat, the Committee discussed in detail its programme of work for the substantive meetings in 1979. In the light of various resolutions and decisions adopted by the General Assembly at its thirty-third session, the Committee agreed upon the following agenda for its substantive meetings:

- 1. Calendar of conferences and meetings of the United Nations for the biennium 1980-1981.
- 2. Management of conference resources.
- Implementation of General Assembly resolutions 32/71, 33/55, 33/56 and decision 33/417.
- 4. Adoption of the report.

9. Other matters specifically referred by the General Assembly to the Committee on Conferences included:

(a) Making the necessary changes in the calendar of meetings in order to accommodate the resumed thirty-third session of the General Assembly (General Assembly decision 33/432);

(b) Studying the possibility of rearranging the calendar of conferences in such a way as to enable the Disarmament Commission and its Committee of the Whole to hold simultaneous meetings, if necessary (General Assembly resolution 33/116 B).

10. One delegation suggested codifying the mandate of the Committee on Conferences in view of the large number of resolutions on the pattern of conferences and on documentation questions passed by the General Assembly in the past. Such an effort could lead to a single, comprehensive, clear and current "charter" of the Committee on Conferences, by which all past decisions on the subject might be superseded or subsumed.

11. The documents submitted to the Committee on Conferences by the Secretariat are listed in annex I.

#### CHAPTER III. CALENDAR OF CONFERENCES

12. In its resolution 33/55 of 14 December 1978, the General Assembly approved the draft revised calendar of conferences and meetings for 1979 set forth in annex I to the report of the Committee on Conferences. 1/ Subsequent decisions taken by the Assembly and other organs that affected the calendar were reflected in document A/AC.172/18 issued on 26 January 1979. The Committee acted under its mandate on several occasions to deal with intersessional departures from the approved calendar.

## Matters related to, and intersessional departures from, the approved calendar for 1979

#### 1. Resumed thirty-third session of the General Assembly

13. Following a decision by the General Assembly to authorize the Committee on Conferences to make the necessary changes in the calendar of meetings of other organs which were scheduled to meet during the resumption of the thirty-third session of the General Assembly, the Committee on Conferences met on 28 December 1978 to consider the programme of meetings during the period 15 to 26 January 1979.

14. The Committee decided that the third special session of the Committee on Natural Resources, originally scheduled for the period 15 to 24 January 1979, should be postponed, with its dates to be determined by the Economic and Social Council at its organizational session for 1979. While acknowledging the difficulties the Committee on Natural Resources would face, the Committee on Conferences concluded that, in the light of the programme of meetings planned during the period 15 to 26 January 1979, a decision to postpone the session of the Committee was the only practical way to enable the General Assembly to resume its thirty-third session.

# 2. <u>Programme of meetings for the period 14 May to</u> <u>8 June 1979 and the requirements of the</u> <u>Disarmament Commission</u>

15. The Committee on Conferences was informed by the Secretariat that following the adoption of General Assembly resolution 33/116 B, the Economic and Social Council, at its organizational session for 1979, had taken several decisions with regard to the calendar of conferences for 1979 which changed the previously established conference schedule for the period 14 May to 8 June 1979 in such a way that appropriate conference facilities could be made available for only one meeting in the morning and one meeting in the afternoon. In these circumstances,

II. simultaneous meetings of the Disarmament Commission and of a Committee of the Whole, which the Commission was empowered to set up, did not appear to be feasible. Subsequently, decisions of the Economic and Social Council released resources sufficient to enable a Committee of the Whole of the Disarmament Commission to meet, if necessary, during the first three weeks of the four-week session.

16. The Committee was also told that, although it might be difficult to accommodate a Committee of the Whole during the last week of the session, when a number of other organs were scheduled to meet, it was conceivable that meetings of the Committee of the Whole during that week could, if necessary, be arranged on an ad hoc basis.

17. The Committee on Conferences then noted that satisfactory arrangements could be made to meet the requirements of the Disarmament Commission.

# 3. Resumed thirty-third session of the General Assembly in pursuance of General Assembly resolution 33/182 A

18. The Committee on Conferences was informed by the Secretariat that, as a result of General Assembly resolution 33/182 A of 21 December 1978, certain adjustments in the calendar of conferences would be needed to enable the reconvened thirty-third session of the General Assembly to meet, as all large conference rooms had already been assigned to other scheduled bodies.

19. The Committee on Conferences noted that, for the purpose of accommodating the General Assembly, the Disarmament Commission could hold only two meetings a day during the period 23 to 30 May 1979, although if the Disarmament Commission requested more meetings, these requirements would be met to the extent that cancellations of other scheduled meetings permitted.

# 4. <u>Fifth session of the Preparatory Committee for the</u> <u>United Nations Conference on Science and Technology</u> for Development

20. The Committee on Conferences was informed that the Preparatory Committee for the United Nations Conference on Science and Technology for Development had agreed at the end of its fourth session to ask the Secretariat, in accordance with paragraph 6 of General Assembly resolution 33/192 of 29 January 1979, to provide the necessary services for two weeks of informal consultations at Headquarters prior to the convening of the fifth session of the Preparatory Committee, which was scheduled to take place from 22 June to 6 July 1979.

21. The Committee on Conferences noted that no large conference room was available for assignment to informal consultations during the two-week period prior to the fifth session of the Preparatory Committee, as all suitable conference rooms had already been assigned to organs scheduled under the calendar of conferences. The Committee also noted that it might be possible for large conference room facilities to be made available on an <u>ad hoc</u> basis, that is, if cancellations of scheduled meetings occurred, and also that facilities of a small conference room could be used for the informal consultations. The Committee requested the Secretariat to examine this alternative further, along with other suggestions made by delegations in the course of the consideration of this matter, and to make every effort to accommodate the informal consultations.

#### 5. Departures not requiring action by the Committee

22. The Committee agreed that, in accordance with past practice, the Secretariat should deal with departures that do not have financial or administrative implications, do not involve matters of policy or entail significant administrative changes in the calendar of conferences and should inform it of any actions taken.

23. In the course of the year, the Committee received information about and took note of several changes of this kind, mainly resulting from decisions of the Economic and Social Council.

## 6. Additions to or changes in the conference programme

24. The Committee considered three requests for additions or changes to the approved calendar of conferences and meetings.

# (a) <u>Preparatory Meeting for the Fifth Ministerial Session of the World Food</u> Council

25. The Executive Director of the World Food Council requested, on behalf of the Bureau of the World Food Council, that a preparatory meeting for the Fifth Ministerial Session of the World Food Council, scheduled to take place in Ottawa from 4 to 7 September 1979, be held at Headquarters during the period 29 May to 1 June 1979.

26. During discussion of this request, it was noted that the newly established Committee to Review United Nations Public Information Policies and Activities had requested use of the same conference room during that period, the only one available with adequate seating capacity. Subsequently, the Executive Director of the World Food Council withdrew the request for this meeting.

# (b) Group of Experts on Disarmament and International Security

27. The first session of the Group of Experts on Disarmament and International Security was scheduled to take place at Headquarters from 26 February to 2 March 1979. Owing to the delay in the nomination of experts, the Secretary-General appointed the Group only in mid-April 1979 and thus this first session had to be postponed. It was requested that the session be held from 5 to 8 June 1979 at Geneva.

28. The Committee decided to approve this request on the understanding that no additional appropriations would be required for its servicing.

# (c) Expert Group on Tax Treaties between Developed and Developing Countries

29. The Committee received a request to change the venue of the eighth session of the Expert Group on Tax Treaties between Developed and Developing Countries, scheduled to take place from 10 to 21 December 1979, from New York to Geneva. The Committee approved the request on the understanding that no additional appropriations would be required for its servicing. 7. <u>Calendar of conferences and meetings of the</u> United Nations for the biennium 1980-1981

#### (a) Principles and decisions relevant to the establishment of the calendar

30. The Committee received a note by the Secretariat containing the principles and decisions affecting the formulation and establishment of the calendar of conferences which had been adopted by the General Assembly over the past years.

31. The Committee was informed that the impending transfer of certain Secretariat units to Vienna, which was to become the established headquarters of a number of United Nations bodies, would require changes in the list of exceptions from the pattern of conferences, which stipulated that each United Nations body should plan to meet at its established headquarters, that is, at the seat of its substantive servicing unit.

32. The Committee on Conferences was informed of the following principles and decisions which govern the establishment of the biennial calendar for 1980-1981:

(a) The calendar of conferences and meetings of the United Nations shall contain a biennial programme of conferences in line with the two-year cycle of the programme budget of the Organization;

(b) The calendar shall govern the meeting programme of the United Nations during the period concerned and all United Nations meetings shall be carried out within the resources allocated by the General Assembly for that purpose;

(c) Between sessions of the General Assembly, departures from the calendar may, in special or unusual circumstances, be approved by the Committee on Conferences, provided that changes affecting the subsequent year of the biennium shall be approved by the Assembly;

(d) If and when such intersessional departures from the approved calendar are granted by the Committee on Conferences, the servicing shall be financed from the approved appropriations for conference services;

(e) Under the pattern of conferences, each United Nations body shall plan to meet at its established headquarters, that is, the seat of its substantive servicing unit within the Secretariat, with the following exceptions:

- (i) The Governing Council of the United Nations Development Programme may, in accordance with its rules of procedure, hold one of its sessions at the United Nations Office at Geneva;
- (ii) The sessions of the International Law Commission shall be held at Geneva;
- (iii) The sessions of the United Nations Commission on International Trade Law may be held alternately at Headquarters in New York and at Vienna;

- (iv) The regular summer session of the Economic and Social Council may be held at Geneva provided that the closing date falls at least six weeks before the opening of the regular session of the General Assembly;
- (v) The functional commissions of the Economic and Social Council other than the Commission on Human Rights and the Commission on Narcotic Drugs shall meet at their established headquarters unless a more rational pattern of the work programme can be achieved by holding their sessions at Geneva, that decision being without prejudice to any subsequent decision to hold them at Vienna; 2/
- (vi) The regular sessions of the Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific, the Economic Commission for Latin America, the Economic Commission for Africa and the Economic Commission for Western Asia, as well as meetings of their subsidiary bodies, may be held away from their headquarters when the commission concerned so decides, subject, in the case of regular sessions of the commissions, to the approval of the Economic and Social Council and of the General Assembly;
- (vii) The International Civil Service Commission shall hold its regular annual session at Headquarters and, if more than one session is required in any one year, it may accept an invitation from one of its participating organizations to hold its other session or sessions at the headquarters of that participating organization;
- (viii) The sessions of the Legal Sub-Committee of the Committee on the Peaceful Uses of Outer Space shall be held alternately at Geneva and New York;

(ix) The Committee on Disarmament shall meet at Geneva;

(f) United Nations bodies may hold sessions, or conferences may be convened, away from their established headquarters when a Government issuing an invitation for a session to be held within its territory agrees, after consultation with the Secretary-General as to their nature and possible extent, to defray the actual additional costs directly or indirectly involved;

(g) An adequate interval of time, to be determined by the body concerned, shall elapse between sessions of the same body, so that Member States may derive maximum benefit from the meetings and be afforded sufficient time for the preparation of future activities;

(h) United Nations bodies should review the length and cycle of their sessions with a view to exploring possibilities of shortening them and of meeting on a biennial basis or less frequently;

(i) The length of a future session of a body shall be examined by the Committee on Conferences, in consultation with the body concerned, on the basis of experience in the use of the allocated meeting time during its preceding session or sessions;

(j) Subsidiary organs of the General Assembly shall not, without the approval of the Assembly, create new standing bodies or <u>ad hoc</u> sessional or intersessional bodies that require additional resources, and other principal organs of the United Nations shall make similar decisions with regard to their respective subsidiary bodies;

(k) The provision of meeting records is governed by criteria approved by the General Assembly in resolution 3415 (XXX).

# (b) Invitations extended by specialized agencies of the United Nations system to United Nations bodies

33. In the course of its deliberations, the Committee also considered whether the rule that United Nations bodies may hold sessions away from their established headquarters when a Government issuing an invitation for a session to be held within its territory agrees, after consultation with the Secretary-General as to their nature and possible extent, to defray the actual additional costs directly or indirectly involved, could be applied, <u>mutatis mutandis</u>, to invitations extended by specialized agencies of the United Nations system to bodies listed in the calendar of conferences and meetings of the United Nations.

The Committee emphasized that such invitations should not be encouraged. 34. It noted that the additional expenditure involved would, in the end, have to be borne by the Governments of Member States. It noted that the Secretary-General had drawn attention to the negative impact which meetings held away from headquarters had on the efficiency with which the continuing work of the Organization was conducted. The view was also expressed that, given the established machinery within ACC, it should be possible to provide for contacts within the United Nations system by regular communication among the secretariats. However, it was felt that, as there could be circumstances in which there would be advantages in such meetings of United Nations bodies, each invitation should be considered on its own merits. A distinction should be made between invitations received from the secretariat of a specialized agency and those extended by the governing body of a specialized agency. It was also suggested that a formal procedure be instituted whereby the Committee on Conferences would be consulted before any invitation was accepted.

35. It was also proposed that information be obtained from specialized agencies on whether they had established rules relative to the handling of invitations received for various bodies.

36. While emphasizing that, as a general principle, such invitations should not be encouraged, the Committee on Conferences recommends that the General Assembly should instruct United Nations bodies, when they receive invitations from specialized agencies to hold their sessions at their headquarters, to consult with the Committee on Conferences or, when in session, with the General Assembly prior to responding to the invitations.

## (c) Calendar of conferences for 1980-1981

37. The Committee discussed the calendar of conferences for 1980-1981 on the basis of a draft calendar submitted by the Secretariat showing meetings of organs of the United Nations, their subsidiary bodies and expert groups. Conferences and meetings of the main legislative and executive bodies of the specialized agencies and the International Atomic Energy Agency were also listed for information, with their dates and venues.

38. The Committee was also informed that difficulties in the scheduling, management and servicing of the conference programme of the United Nations might arise if additions were made to the heavy meeting programme set out in the draft calendar. Such additions might be necessary if the General Assembly, at its thirty-fourth session, were to decide:

(a) To renew the mandate of certain bodies: as legislative authority for the scheduling of meetings of such bodies in the next biennium does not yet exist, no provision could be made for them in the draft calendar;

(b) To authorize formally meetings of bodies whose establishment is already envisaged (such as the Preparatory Committee for the United Nations Conference on New and Renewable Sources of Energy or the Intergovernmental Committee on Science and Technology for Development);

(c) To approve additional sessions for certain bodies;

(d) To set up new bodies.

39. Accordingly, the Committee on Conferences recommends to the General Assembly that it be empowered to make any further adjustments in the calendar of conferences for 1980 which may be required as a result of decisions by the Assembly at its thirty-fourth session.

As recommended by the General Assembly in decision 33/417, the Committee on 40. Conferences and the Economic and Social Council consulted closely in the preparation of the calendar of conferences. The Committee had an opportunity to examine the draft calendar of conferences and meetings of the Economic and Social Ccuncil for the next biennium before it was submitted to the Council at its second regular session. It was subsequently informed by the Assistant Secretary-General. Office of Secretariat Services for Economic and Social Matters, of the results of the deliberations of the Council on the calendar of conferences and meetings and on the control and limitation of documentation. The Committee noted with satisfaction decision 1979/81 of the Economic and Social Council concerning the calendar of conferences and meetings and, in particular, the decision that, once the calendar of meetings had been adopted, no additional departures from the biennial cycle of meetings would be authorized during the biennium. The Committee on Conferences decided to recommend to the General Assembly that it should authorize the Secretariat to set the opening dates of the session of the functional commissions and standing committees of the Economic and Social Council in a flexible manner, in order to ensure that the bodies concerned make optimum use of the conference facilities available to them. The Committee also welcomed Council resolutions 1979/1, 1979/41 and 1979/69 on control and limitation of documentation and agreed that other United Nations organs should be encouraged to follow the example of the Economic and Social Council in these areas.

41. As the Third United Nations Conference on the Law of the Sea had decided to convene a ninth session in 1980, the first part to take place from 3 March to 4 April at Headquarters, the Committee, in view of the priority accorded to the Conference by the General Assembly in paragraph 2 of resolution 3483 (XXX) of 12 December 1975, decided to change the venue of some meetings in the draft calendar originally submitted by the Secretariat from New York to Geneva so that all stated servicing requirements of the Conference could be fully met, as follows: the ninth session of the Human Rights Committee (scheduled to be held from 17 March to 4 April 1980), its Working Group on Communications (scheduled to be held from 10 to 14 March 1980) and the twenty-first session of the Committee on the Elimination of Racial Discrimination (scheduled to be held from 24 March to 4 April 1980).

42. With these amendments, the Committee adopted the draft calendar as set forth in annex II below and agreed to recommend it for approval by the General Assembly.

43. It was suggested that the venue of the Sixth United Nations Congress on the Prevention of Crime and the Treatment of Offenders should read Vienna. As, however, the Economic and Social Council, by its decision 1979/82, had decided to take a final decision in that regard at its resumed second regular session in 1979, the Committee did not pursue this question.

44. The Committee's attention was drawn to the fact that reconstruction work in the Headquarters building would continue in 1980. According to the present schedule, work in the small conference rooms 5 and 6 was to commence on 1 January 1980 and was expected to be completed by 1 June 1980. Although the reconstruction of the six large conference rooms, carried out in 1978 and 1979, would have been entirely completed by the beginning of the new biennium, the reconstruction activities in the small conference rooms would limit certain conference activities at Headquarters and this in turn could thus adversely affect the implementation of the calendar of conferences.

## (d) Special conferences

45. The Committee was provided with a list of special conferences and meetings already proposed or scheduled to be held during the forthcoming biennium which indicated that nine special conferences had already been proposed or scheduled for 1980 and that it seemed unlikely that those could be organized without overlap. The Committee discussed this situation in the light of General Assembly resolution 33/55, which, <u>inter alia</u>, stipulated that no more than one special conference of the United Nations should be convened at the same time. It agreed that the question of the number of special conferences should be kept under review, bearing in mind the relevant recommendation made by the Joint Inspection Unit (see para. 58 below).

#### CHAPTER IV. MANAGEMENT OF CONFERENCE RESOURCES

46. In its decision 33/416, the General Assembly, recalling its request in resolution 3351 (XXIX) of 18 December 1974 that the Committee on Conferences consider the feasibility of a quota system to allocate resources among various fields of activity, requested the Committee to continue in 1979 its consideration of the question of the advantages and disadvantages of the introduction of such a system for the allocation of conference resources. In the same decision, the Assembly requested the Committee to study the justifiability of the existing workloads of the conference service personnel and to report thereon to the Assembly at its thirty-fourth session. The Committee on Conferences discussed both issues in detail at its first series of substantive meetings.

#### A. Quota system for the allocation of conference resources

47. Committee consideration of this question was based on a report by the Secretariat (CRP.79) prepared in response to the request made by the General Assembly in decision 33/416. The report reviewed past deliberations on the subject of a quota system, which date back to the twenty-sixth session of the Assembly. The report indicated that the term "quota system" had been applied over the years to proposals of varying purpose, scope and substance, in relation to conference services and activities; it had also been applied loosely to proposals for the control of documentation and measures for limiting conference activity, from some of which any idea of a quota had been absent.

48. Most proposals, however, had in common three objectives, namely, (a) to develop a tool or tools which could assist Member States in establishing priorities among proposals for conferences in various fields of activity and facilitating decisions on the level and intensity of their participation; (b) to devise appropriate means to achieve a more efficient and economical use of available resources; and (c) to seek instruments for improving the rational planning and effective co-ordination of all services at the Secretariat level in order to provide adequate conference services for all approved programmes and meetings.

49. In this light, the Secretariat proposed that the term "quota system" should be replaced by the following words, which more accurately reflected the intentions of groups and officials who had made such proposals: "set of measures to improve the efficiency and effectiveness of the conference activities of the Organization".

50. The report noted that general recognition of the need for reasonable controls on documentation and conference activity, and for more efficient and economic use of available resources, was already embodied in rules developed by the General Assembly in the context of the pattern and calendar of conferences. In addition, the Secretariat described a number of measures instituted in various areas on a selective basis, which had been designed to achieve improved rationalization and efficiency in conference activities, and noted that additional measures were under consideration. 51. The report concluded by stating that any such comprehensive set of measures would depend for their effectiveness both on the precision of formulation and, given the complexity of the issues involved, on the degree of flexibility which they allowed; moreover the introduction of new regulations implied the availability of appropriate control mechanisms whose establishment on a permanent basis might lead to a situation in which the requirements for Secretariat services could no longer be absorbed within the existing capacity of the Secretariat.

52. The Committee recognized that there were practical limitations to the capactiy of the Secretariat to service meetings. To the extent that shortages of servicing staff can affect the ability of the conference secretariat to provide full services, it was not in practice easy to establish what these limitations might be at any particular time. There have, however, been a good many occasions when the Secretariat has had to advise that because of full utilization of conference or interpretation facilities it would be unable to service proposed additional meetings. The Committee noted in particular that, because of limitations in human resources, it was important that there should be no departure from the rule of "no overlap" in the scheduling of special conferences; that the attention of various bodies of the United Nations should be drawn to the need to exercise restraint in proposing their meeting schedules; and that the Secretariat, as the "memory" of the system, had a special responsibility to ensure that all bodies calling on their services were made aware of the limits to its servicing capacity (there was an opportunity for the Secretariat to do this when reporting on practical and financial implications of conference proposals).

53. Some delegations thought the Committee should go further than this, for example:

(a) In circumstances in which intergovernmental bodies seem to have lost control of the meeting schedule, the discipline of a formal quota system would reinforce efforts to restrain expenditure and improve management of United Nations resources;

(b) The General Assembly should be advised that the continuing increase in the number of conferences imposes strains on the Secretariat's ability adequately to service meetings, as well as on the Organization's finances, and accordingly that some form of limit should be set to the number (or total duration) of conferences; after a review of priorities, all conferences above that limit should be financed by the cancellation of meetings of lesser priority;

(c) The possibility should be explored of establishing a time-sharing system for conference activity under which bodies which did not make full use of the time allocated to them would, at subsequent meetings, receive a reduced allocation, the unused portion being allocated to a time bank, which could be drawn on to support other activities or sectors;

(d) An allocation of meeting time within the capacity of the Secretariat could be allocated to programme sectors on the basis of past levels of activity in those sectors;

(e) The Secretary-General should be requested to submit to the appropriate United Nations bodies a study on the feasibility of integrating conference servicing costs with individual programme budgets, thereby making programme managers accountable for those costs; Member States would also then be better able to see the total real costs of programmes they were advocating.

54. A number of delegations did not support these suggestions. It was commented that problems do not come in quotas; that quota systems would inevitably limit flexibility and the Organization's ability to respond in timely fashion to new perceptions and needs; that additional conferences were not proposed lightly and many dealt with major and pressing problems (such as the new international economic order and disarmament); moreover, it was not the task of the Committee on Conferences to limit conference activities. On the question of budgetary controls on conference activity, it was suggested that this matter, which was outside the Committee's terms of reference, would be more appropriately considered in the Fifth Committee. On the imposition of formal limits to conference activity, or quotas, it was commented that the United Nations conference programme could never be fixed and static - it was dynamic and complex, and problems arising from the expansion of activity could not be dealt with by seeking to impose arbitrary restrictions on the conference programme; further, to use levels of activity in earlier years as a basis for establishing future quotas would be unacceptable, since these reflect the priorities of the past and can take no account of current or future perceptions of Member States or of their political will to seek solutions within the framework of the United Nations.

55. To several delegations it also appeared doubtful whether any of the suggested quota systems would in practice work. Some of them emphasized that any measures to be proposed by the Committee should be of a regulatory rather than of a mandatory character and that rigidity should be avoided. The Committee, it was accordingly suggested, should simply emphasize that there were limits to the capacity of the Secretariat to provide services and call on the Secretariat to ensure that conference bureaux were made fully aware of these limits. In addition, the Committee might recommend to the General Assembly that it should urge United Nations bodies to examine critically all proposals for new activities and to exercise restraint in recommending additional conferences. In more than a few cases, it was suggested, it would do no harm if, in the interests of an effective over-all conference programme, meetings were postponed or means found of handling questions in ways other than calling a special meeting for the purpose. Several delegations also noted that, if marginal or obsolete activities could be identified and eliminated, resources thus released could be reallocated to priority activities under way, or to new necessary activities or meetings to which the General Assembly attached priority.

56. The Committee also discussed possible regulatory mechanisms in the area of documentation, with particular reference to documentation generated by Member States, but it did not pursue this matter since members felt it was up to the individual delegations to impose a measure of self-discipline. The Committee agreed that there should be close consultation between the Economic and Social Council and the Committee on Conferences with respect to documentation, and it requested the bureau to establish the necessary contacts. One delegation suggested a review of the criteria governing meeting records, which could be carried out parallel to the forthcoming review by the Council so that mutually reinforcing economies might be realized. In addition, the Secretariat was requested by that delegation to study further the feasibility of improving the management of documentation.

57. On the basis of its discussions, the Committee observed that the present level of conference and meeting activity of United Nations bodies imposes strains on the

capacity of the Secretariat, both in human and physical terms, to service meetings adequately, and on delegations to cope with the ongoing meeting programme. In such a situation, certain delegations suggested that it might become necessary for the General Assembly to address itself to the question of priorities. In view of the basic disagreement among delegations over the merits of a quota system, several delegations considered it doubtful whether such a system should be further pursued. Some delegations were in favour of introducing quotas for meetings of the United Nations. It was concluded that attention should be given to developing and applying a set of measures to improve the efficiency and effectiveness of the conference activities of the Organization, as proposed by the Secretariat, and that it was equally import for the Secretariat to maintain and improve good management of the available resources. The Committee therefore could concentrate in future on ensuring stricter observance of rules already endorsed by the General Assembly and, in general, on preparing and developing a comprehensive set of measures, of a regulatory rather than a mandatory character.

58. In relation to special conferences, some delegations recalled General Assembly resolution 2609 (XXIV) of 16 December 1969, in which the Assembly had decided that "as a general rule, not more than one major special conference shall be scheduled in any one year". 3/ This decision had never been rescinded, although some delegations considered that it had been superseded by the acceptance of the Joint Inspection Unit recommendation in 1974 (see A/9795, chap. VII, recommendation 12) that not more than one such conference should be convened annually in each main field of activity (with a limit of three per annum until Secretariat resources could be increased), and by subsequent Assembly approval of a more intensive pattern of major special conferences (in practice, seven per annum during 1978/1979).

59. The Committee noted that the General Assembly had not found it possible to keep within the limits for special conferences recommended by the Joint Inspection Unit; accordingly some members suggested that the Committee recommend to the Assembly that it should adhere more stricly to the terms of past decisions, and in particular to the proposal of the Joint Inspection Unit on the number of conferences in each field of activity.  $\frac{h}{2}$  On the other hand, it was suggested by several delegations that, if the United Nations had failed to implement proposals contained in General Assembly resolutions, this was because circumstances had changed since those resolutions had been adopted; and there would be little point in the

3/ In its report to the General Assembly in 1968, the Committee considered that the question of special conferences should be approached pragmatically. "The main determining factor here must be the existing workload of the conference programme already planned ... if the Assembly decides to convene a special conference to which exceptional importance is attached, the corollary is that it will also be prepared to postpone other meetings if, as a result of scarce resources, the success of the special conference would otherwise be impaired" (Official Records of the General Assembly, Twenty-third Session, agenda item 75, document A/7361, para. 30). The Chairman stated in the General Assembly that para. 11 of resolution 2609 (XXIV) "merely expressed a general principle and did not impose any 'ceiling' on the number of special conferences. The number of special conferences which could be properly serviced during a given year depended on the number of recurrent meetings scheduled for that year" (A/9795, para. 430).

 $\frac{4}{1}$  In its 1974 report, the Joint Inspection Unit stated as one of the advantages of its proposed limitation on special conferences that governmental

Committee's now making similar recommendations that, even if adopted by the Assembly, would in practice join those which are now dead letters. Only if a formula could be devised that adequately met current requirements should the Committee put a proposal to the Assembly. In this regard, one member suggested the addition to the rules of procedure of a rule that when the number of conferences in a given field exceeded one, both should be reconsidered by the appropriate Main Committee. Some delegations proposed that the present level of conference activities of the United Nations be maintained for the period 1980-1981. For this purpose, these delegations felt that any meetings and conferences beyond the level mentioned should be held through the elimination or limitation of those types of United Nations activities which have lower priority or have been completed, are obsolete, of marginal usefulness or ineffective. Other delegations opposed this approach, observing that the increase in the number of special conferences simply reflected a change in the perception of the international community of the tasks of the United Nations, particularly in relation to efforts to establish the new international economic order; moreover, the costs of convening a special conference were clearly presented to and examined by the General Assembly, which was accordingly fully aware of the financial implications of its decisions. Further, some delegations pointed out that the activities which are of lower priority, have been completed, are obsolete, marginally useful or ineffective have yet to be identified.

60. One delegation pointed to the fact that the recommendation of the Joint Inspection Unit had been developed under circumstances in which it was believed that three special conferences was the maximum number that the Secretariat could manage without impeding its ability to cope with other programmes and responsibilities. Several years had since passed and, as indicated by the increased number of meetings which the Secretariat had proved capable of servicing, there had been improvements in the efficiency with which conference services were managed. It was accordingly appropriate that the validity of the assumption of the Joint Inspection Unit be re-examined.

61. Another delegation felt that the General Assembly should not be invited to adopt a stricter principle in regard to special conferences, but that instead attention should be drawn to the present difficulties, which resulted from the disparities between the demand for conference services and the availability of conference facilities and staff, and the Assembly urged the exercise of restraint in its future decisions in order to prevent excessive demands on existing resources. A proposal was also put forward to the effect that, in future years, priorities should be established by the Main Committees of the Assembly, which had

<sup>(</sup>continued)

bodies and the Secretariat staff responsible for each sector would be able "to concentrate full attention on only one such conference a year and tend to ensure more adequate preparation than has sometimes been the case in the past" (A/9795, para. 446). responsibility for considering recommendations for the scheduling of special conferences. Having been unable to agree on the desirability of any formula for limiting the number of special conferences in any one year or in any of the main fields of activity of the United Nations, the Committee concluded that the question would have to be approached pragmatically.

62. Accordingly, the Committee on Conferences, in the light of the difficulties encountered in ensuring the adequate preparation of meetings, including the timely distribution of documentation, as well as the ability of Member States to participate fully, recommends that the General Assembly should instruct the Main Committees to review the number of special conferences of the United Nations already proposed and scheduled in their respective fields of activity prior to deciding upon the scheduling of new and additional special conferences, thus bearing in mind the relevant portions of General Assembly resolution 33/55 of 14 December 1978.

# B. Workload standards for conference servicing personnel

63. The Committee received a report by the Secretariat (CRP.78 and Corr.1) outlining four main categories of conference servicing personnel at the United Nations, namely, substantive conference servicing staff, technical conference servicing staff, Conference Services staff and complementary conference servicing staff.

64. The report stated that workload standards would serve three purposes: (a) to facilitate assessment by intergovernmental bodies of the implications of additions to existing workloads as a means of determining whether the Secretariat units concerned would be able to cope with the new obligations within existing resources; (b) to provide the Secretariat, for internal purposes, with a management tool for measuring the level of productivity and monitoring the performance of various organizational areas and (c) to provide a yardstick for determining the number of conference servicing personnel to be assigned to special conferences and meetings held away from Headquarters.

65. The Committee on Conferences was informed that, while standards of staffing requirements, which were agreed between the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions and the Secretary-General, had been developed for Conference Services staff, they did not yet exist for substantive, technical and complementary servicing staff. Currently the number of such staff assigned to conferences and meetings was determined on an <u>ad hoc</u> basis by each department concerned. The standards for Conference Services staff were currently being **applied at** New York, Geneva and Vienna, as well as for conferences and meetings held away from, but serviced by, those headquarters.

66. These workload standards were described. It was shown, <u>inter alia</u>, in relation to the findings of the Joint Inspection Unit in its report on General Service staff of the United Nations and Geneva-based specialized agencies (A/32/327), that the workload standard for typists at the United Nations was identical with those of the International Telecommunication Union and the International Labour Organisation. The Secretariat also reported on information concerning workload standards for comparable activities of conference servicing staff in national civil services of Governments of host countries of United Nations headquarters stations. 67. The Committee took note of the workload standards reported for Conference Services staff and agreed that they made the level of expenditure predictable to Member States which invited United Nations bodies to meet in their territory. The Committee considered that it would be worth while if workload standards could be established in areas of the Department of Conference Services where none had yet been introduced.

68. Some delegations emphasized the fact that the observed delay in the appearance of documentation was owing in particular to the large number of vacant posts in some of the typing pools. Given the difficulties which the Secretariat seemed to be encountering in recruiting conference typists, those delegations felt that it would be necessary to review the material and financial conditions offered to that category of staff.

69. In the light of information received from the Secretariat, the Committee also considered the impact which technological innovations and improvements in the area of terminology could be expected to have on the efficiency of translation services. The indications were, however, that, while these might in the long-term have positive benefits, there was little prospect that they would in the foreseeable future be able to contribute measurably to any increase in efficiency.

70. As the current standards for the Department of Conference Services had been arrived at as a result of experience, the Committee then agreed that they should be reviewed from time to time in the light of any additional information which might be forthcoming and of technological developments (for example, computerization of the terminology services) which, if introduced, could contribute to improvements in efficiency.

71. The Committee recognized that the question of establishing standards for the other categories of conference servicing staff would in part fall outside its mandate, but noted that it would nevertheless be called upon to accept statements of requirements of other Secretariat units when dealing with requests for intersessional departures from the approved calendar. In the light of this, the Committee decided to recommend to the General Assembly that the Secretary-General be requested to study the feasibility of establishing further workload standards, in particular for technical and complementary conference servicing staff, and to submit a report thereon, through the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions, to the Assembly at its thirty-fifth session.

72. The Committee felt that the information provided on workload standards in host countries of United Nations headquarters did not allow meaningful comparison with United Nations work norms. The Committee on Conferences therefore decided to recommend to the General Assembly that the Secretariat should be requested to continue inquiring about workload standards of national and intergovernmental organizations and to report thereon to the Committee on Conferences in 1980.

#### CHAPTER V. IMPLEMENTATION OF GENERAL ASSEMBLY RESOLUTIONS WITH REGARD TO THE PATTERN OF CONFERENCES

73. In its resolution 32/71 of 9 December 1977, the General Assembly set forth eight guidelines for reducing the wastage resulting from cancellations of scheduled meetings; these were recalled in resolution 33/55 of  $1^{4}$  December 1978. The Secretariat reported on the actions it had taken to promulgate these guidelines, and the extent to which they had been implemented by the various bodies of the United Nations.

7<sup>4</sup>. The Secretariat noted that all replies and observations received to date indicated that a start had been made on the implementation by United Nations bodies of the guidelines adopted by the General Assembly. In recent months, adherence to the guidelines appeared to have improved. This undoubtedly resulted from the efforts of the Department of Conference Services at Headquarters and of the Conference Division at Geneva. Given the resolution and decision adopted by the General Assembly at its thirty-third session on the pattern of conferences and on the management of conference resources (33/55 and 33/417, respectively), it was expected that the degree of implementation of all guidelines would further improve.

75. It was noted in the report by the Secretariat (CRP.83 and Add.1), however, that it was too early to judge what impact the guidelines were likely to have in the longer term; even then it might be difficult to attribute specific developments directly to the effect of these guidelines. It could, nevertheless, be expected that the guidelines would exert a positive influence on the organization and conduct of sessions of United Nations bodies which would ultimately reduce the cancellation figures in the long term. The Secretariat, however, was not only concerned at the cancellation figures as such, but also by the degree of utilization of available resources. Preliminary performance statistics for 1979 suggested that, while the number of cancellations of scheduled meetings had decreased, so had the average duration of meetings. This resulted in wastage through the inadequate usage of allocated conference resources and was equally detrimental to the optimum utilization of available resources.

76. The Committee discussed this report and it was suggested that the Secretariat be asked to circulate, to the secretaries of the various committees, exemplary documents on the organization of work, which had been circulated by various United Nations bodies and brought to the attention of the Committee as models of full compliance with the guidelines.

77. It was agreed that the Secretariat should continue to observe the implementation of the guidelines and to keep the Committee informed of further developments.

78. The Committee on Conferences recommends to the General Assembly that it should reaffirm the existing guidelines and that the Secretariat should be asked to renew its efforts to adhere to them.

#### CHAPTER VI. SUMMARY OF RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE COMMITTEE ON CONFERENCES

79. The recommendations of the Committee on Conferences to the General Assembly are set forth below:

#### Recommendation 1

The Committee recommends that the General Assembly should approve the calendar of conferences as set forth in annex II to this report (see para. 42).

#### Recommendation 2

The Committee recommends that the General Assembly should authorize the Committee on Conferences to make any further adjustments in the calendar of conferences for 1980 which may be required as a result of decisions by the Assembly at its thirty-fourth session (see para. 39).

#### Recommendation 3

The Committee recommends that the General Assembly should authorize the Secretariat to set the opening dates of the sessions of the functional commissions and standing committees of the Economic and Social Council in a flexible manner, in order to ensure that the bodies concerned make optimum use of the conference facilities available to them (see para. 40).

#### Recommendation 4

The Committee recommends that the General Assembly should reaffirm the existing guidelines for reducing the wastage resulting from cancellations of scheduled meetings and request the Secretariat to make renewed efforts to adhere to them (see para. 78).

#### Recommendation 5

The Committee, emphasizing that, as a general principle, invitations from specialized agencies of the United Nations system to United Nations bodies should not be encouraged, recommends that the General Assembly should instruct United Nations bodies, when they receive such invitations, to consult with the Committee on Conferences or, when in session, with the Assembly, before responding to the invitations (see para. 36).

#### Recommendation 6

The Committee, taking into account difficulties encountered in ensuring adequate preparation of meetings, including timely distribution of documentation, as well as the ability of Member States to participate fully, recommends that the General Assembly should instruct the Main Committees to review the number of special conferences of the United Nations already proposed and scheduled in their respective fields of activity prior to deciding upon the scheduling of new and additional special conferences, thus bearing in mind the relevant portions of General Assembly resolution 33/55 (see para. 62).

#### Recommendation 7

The Committee recommends that the General Assembly should request the Secretariat to continue its inquiries concerning workload standards of national and intergovernmental organizations and to report thereon to the Committee on Conferences in 1980 (see para. 72).

80. The Committee on Conferences further recommends to the General Assembly the adoption of the following draft decision:

The General Assembly decides:

(a) To adopt the calendar of conferences and meetings of the United Nations for 1980-1981 as set forth in annex II to the report of the Committee on Conferences (A/34/32);

(b) To adopt the recommendations of the Committee on Conferences contained in chapter V of its report.
