Report of the Fifth Committee

1. At its 33rd and 40th meetings, on 7 and 24 December 2001, the Fifth Committee, pursuant to rule 153 of the rules of procedure of the General Assembly, considered the statement by the Secretary-General (A/C.5/56/24) on the programme budget implications of draft resolution A/C.3/56/L.55. The Chairman of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions orally introduced the related report of that Committee (see A/C.5/56/SR.33).
2. Statements and comments made in the course of the Committee's consideration of this question are reflected in the relevant summary records (A/C.5/56/SR.33 and 40).

Decision of the Fifth Committee

3. The Fifth Committee, having considered the statement on programme budget implications submitted by the Secretary-General (A/C.5/56/24), decides to inform the General Assembly that, should it adopt draft resolution A/C.3/56/L.55, an amount of \$277,900 would be charged against the provision for special political missions, under section 3, Political affairs, of the programme budget for the biennium 2002-2003.
