SUMMARY STATEMENT BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL ON MATTERS
OF WHICH THE SECURITY COUNCIL IS SEIZED AND ON THE
STAGE REACHED IN THEIR CONSIDERATION

Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The list of items of which the Security Council is seized is contained in documents S/15560 of 11 January 1983, S/15560/Add.8 of 3 March 1983 and S/15560/Add.12 of 31 March 1983.

During the week ending 14 May 1983, the Security Council took action on the following item:

Letter dated 5 May 1983 from the representative of Nicaragua on the Security Council addressed to the President of the Security Council

In a letter dated 5 May 1983 addressed to the President of the Security Council (S/15746), the representative of Nicaragua requested that a meeting of the Security Council be convened as a matter of urgency for the purpose of reviewing the situation and considering possible measures to be taken in view of the launching of a new stage in the invasion of his country.

The Security Council considered the item at its 2431st meeting, held on 9 May 1983. The Council continued its discussion at the 2432nd meeting, held on 13 May 1983.

In the course of the meetings, the President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Algeria, Cuba, Ethiopia, Grenada, Guatemala, Honduras, the Islamic Republic of Iran, the Libyan Arab Jamahiriya, Mali, Mexico, Seychelles and the Syrian Arab Republic, at their request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.
