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## Special Committee on the Situation with regard to the Implementation of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples

### Organization of work

#### Note by the Chairman

##### 1. Subsidiary bodies

1. During its previous sessions, the Special Committee conducted its work by considering the items directly at its plenary meetings. The meetings of the Bureau are open to all the members of the Special Committee. The Special Committee has increasingly relied upon informal consultations, thus striving to keep the number of its formal meetings to a minimum.

2. The Chairman recommends to the Special Committee that it continue to use informal meetings to the maximum extent possible. In the meantime, the Chairman may wish to discuss urgent as well as specific issues with the Bureau.

##### 2. Allocation of items and procedure for consideration

3. Annexed to the present note is a list of pending matters for consideration by the Special Committee during the year. It includes decisions adopted by the Special Committee, together with an indication of the procedure that the Committee may wish to adopt for each item. In this regard, the Chairman would like to draw the attention of the Special Committee, in particular, to paragraph 8 (d) of General Assembly resolution 56/74 of 10 December 2001, in which the Special Committee was requested to finalize, before the end of 2002, a constructive programme of work on a case-by-case basis for the Non-Self-Governing Territories to facilitate the implementation of the mandate of the Special Committee and the relevant resolutions on decolonization, including resolutions on specific Territories.

4. The Special Committee should take into account the resolutions and decisions adopted by the General Assembly at its fifty-sixth session that are relevant to the work of the Committee, as listed in the note by the Secretary-General (A/AC.109/2002/L.1). It is also understood that the Special Committee should continue to be guided by the relevant provisions of the plan of action for the Second



International Decade for the Eradication of Colonialism for the period 2001-2010 (A/56/61, annex), declared by the General Assembly in its resolution 55/146 of 8 December 2000.

**3. Order of priority for consideration of items**

5. The Chairman will hold consultations with regard to the order of priority to be given for consideration of items in plenary meetings.

6. It is also his intention to hold consultations on specific activities envisaged under the plan of action for the Second International Decade for the Eradication of Colonialism.

7. In the meantime, subject to the availability of the working papers prepared by the Secretariat, it is suggested that the Special Committee conduct its substantive work in accordance with the schedule of meetings approved by the General Assembly at its fifty-sixth session.<sup>1</sup>

**4. Recommendations of the Special Committee to the General Assembly**

8. In accordance with paragraph 31 of General Assembly decision 34/401 of 29 November 1979, and in the light of past experience and established practice, it is suggested that the Special Committee continue to follow the procedure adopted at its 1982 session<sup>2</sup> authorizing its Rapporteur to reformulate its decisions into draft decisions in General Assembly form and to submit them to the Assembly at its fifty-seventh session. The Special Committee may also wish to recommend that its Rapporteur continue to follow the format of its report to the General Assembly adopted at the 2000 session of the Special Committee.

**5. Utilization of conference-servicing resources**

9. At its fifty-sixth session, the General Assembly decided to waive rules 67 and 108 of its rules of procedure in order to permit meetings to be declared open and debates to proceed without the presence of the quorum required under those rules. The Assembly also decided that morning meetings should begin at 10.

10. As those measures have further enhanced the effective utilization of conference-servicing resources, it is suggested that the Special Committee continue to follow the same procedure. It should be understood that, in accordance with the rules cited, the presence of a majority of the members would continue to be required for any decisions to be taken.
