Organization of the session and administrative matters

A. Opening and duration of the session

1. The Commission on Narcotic Drugs held its reconvened forty-fourth session in Vienna from 12 to 14 December 2001. The Chairman of the Commission opened the session. The Executive Director of UNDCP, the representative of Egypt, on behalf of the Group of 77 and China, the representative of Malaysia, on behalf of the Group of Asian States, the representative of Morocco, on behalf of the Group of African States, the representative of Uruguay, on behalf of the Group of Latin American and Caribbean States, the representative of Belgium, on behalf of the States Members of the United Nations that are members of the European Union, and the representatives of the United States of America, Japan, Turkey, China, the Islamic Republic of Iran, Mexico, Italy, Afghanistan, Ecuador, the Russian Federation, Zimbabwe, Colombia, Peru, Bolivia, South Africa, the Republic of Korea, Kazakhstan and Nigeria addressed the Commission at its opening meeting.
