Letter dated 7 September 1988 from the Permanent Representative of
Pakistan to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General

Further to my letter dated 1 September 1988 (A/43/585-S/20167), I have the honour to report to you the following incidents in violation of Pakistan territory from the Afghanistan side, which occurred on 5 and 7 September 1988:

On 5 September 1988, at 0640 hours, six Afghan aircraft entered approximately 45 kilometres into Pakistan air space and dropped six bombs near

village Dogai in District Dir. As a result, 1 schoolboy was killed, 6 civilians injured (all Pakistan nationals) and 12 houses damaged.

On 7 September 1988, between 0905 hours and 1030 hours, the Afghan armed forces fired 23 tank rounds which landed in Chaman city and surrounding areas. As a result, nine persons, including seven Pakistanis and two Afghan refugees, were seriously injured.

On 7 September 1988, between 0924 and 0929 hours, four Afghan aircraft entered 28 nautical miles into Pakistan air space and dropped nine bombs on the villages Khasana, Khyma and Bandagai near Timargara, District Dir. As a result, three Pakistan nationals were seriously injured.

The Afghan Chargé d'affaires was called to the Foreign Office at Islamabad on the morning of 7 September 1988, and a strong protest was lodged with him over the unprovoked attacks. He was asked to inform the authorities in Kabul that if such attacks did not cease the entire responsibility for the serious consequences would rest on them.

I request you to have this letter circulated as a document of the General Assembly, under items 30, 72, 130, 134 and 137 of the provisional agenda and of the Security Council.
