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Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 1267 (1999)

Note verbale dated 28 May 2002 from the Permanent Mission of the People's Republic of China to the United Nations addressed to the Chairman of the Committee

The Permanent Mission of the People's Republic of China to the United Nations presents its compliments to the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 1267 (1999) and has the honour to submit the attached report on the measures that China has taken to implement resolution 1390 (2002) (see annex).

Report by China on the implementation of Security Council resolution 1390 (2002)

Following the adoption by the Security Council of resolution 1390 (2002) of 15 January 2002, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of China, acting in accordance with national laws and regulations, issued a circular to the various branches of Government as well as to the governments of provinces, municipalities, autonomous regions and the Special Administrative Regions of Hong Kong and Macao, instructing them to comply with and implement the resolution. The circular stressed that the resolution, which prescribed mandatory measures adopted in accordance with Chapter VII of the Charter of the United Nations, was legally binding on all States. In order to fulfil China's international obligations, all relevant branches of Government must effectively implement the resolution by taking concrete measures appropriate to their particular situations. The circular called for the immediate freezing of funds and other financial assets or economic resources of individuals, groups, businesses and entities belonging to the Taliban and Al Qaeda; preventing members of the Taliban and Al Qaeda from entering or travelling through China; preventing the provision of arms materiel and military-related technical advice, assistance or training to members of the Taliban and Al Qaeda from China's territory, by Chinese nationals abroad, or using ships or aircraft flying China's flag. The circular has been published in the *State Council Gazette*.

The various branches of Government and the governments of the provinces, municipalities, autonomous regions and the special Administrative Regions of Hong Kong and Macao have all taken measures to implement the said resolution, and to date no violations of the resolution have been reported.
