# **Conditions of service of non-full-time judges of the International Criminal Court**

## Discussion paper by the Coordinator

Judges who are not required to serve full time at the Court shall be entitled to:

### A. Allowances

#### 1. Annual allowance

An annual allowance, payable monthly, of one third of the annual remuneration paid to a full-time judge, i.e., one third of 180,000 euros, or 60,000 euros.

#### 2. Special allowance when engaged on the business of the Court

A special allowance of 270 euros for each day that a judge is engaged on the business of the Court, as certified by the Presidency.

#### 3. Subsistence allowance

A subsistence allowance, at the applicable United Nations rate in euros, for each day that a judge attends meetings of the Court.

#### **B.** Benefits

#### 4. Pension

The judges on non-full-time status are not entitled to a pension benefit. Once they are called to serve as a full-time judge, the pension benefit provisions of a full-time judge will be applicable.

## 5. Health insurance

Judges will be responsible for their own health insurance.

## 6. Travel costs

Travel to official meetings of the Court. All travel shall be by business-class travel between the declared home and the seat of the Court by the most direct route.
