DRAFT RESOLUTION ON THE ECYPTIAN QUESTION SUBMITTED BY THE REPRESENTATIVE OF COLOMBIA AT THE 198TH MEETING OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL

The Security Council,

Having considered the dispute between the United Kingdom and Egypt brought to its attention by the latter of the Prime Minister of Egypt dated 8 July 1947,

CALIS UPON the Governments of the United Kingdom and Egypt:

- (a) To resume direct negotiations with a view:
 - (1) To completing at the earliest possible date the evacuation of all British military, naval and air forces from Egyptian territory, mutual assistance being provided in order to safeguard in time of war or imminent threat of war the liberty and security of navigation of the Suez Canal; and
 - (2) To terminating the joint administration of the Sudan with due regard to the principle of self determination of peoples and their right to self-government;
- (b) To keep the Security Council readily informed of the progress of their negotiations.
