

REPORT OF THE SECRETARY-GENERAL ON THE CREDENTIALS OF  
REPRESENTATIVES TO THE SECURITY COUNCIL FOR THE  
DISCUSSION OF THE INDONESIAN QUESTION

Further to my previous reports on the credentials of representatives to the Security Council for the discussion of the Indonesian question and following the decision of the Security Council at its 184th meeting on 14 August 1947 I have the honour to submit the following report on the credentials of the Representative of the Republic of the Philippines.

I have received a letter dated 15 August 1947 signed by the Permanent Representative of the Philippines to the United Nations enclosing a copy of a radiogram from the President of the Philippines dated in Manila on 15 August 1947. This radiogram invests Brigadier General Carlos P. Romulo, the Permanent Representative of the Philippines to the United Nations, with full powers and authority for and in the name of the Republic of the Philippines to participate in the discussion of the Indonesian question before the Security Council.

In my opinion, this radiogram constitutes adequate provisional credentials.
