4. It will be noted that agrement has not been reached in the Bilitnly Steff Comittee on two pointsoi.e. Section VI] of the Revised [raf'b suthte and Rule 2 of the lievised Draft fules of lrocedure. The aiver,int vjevs of the Leiegations are set out in parallel colunns.

    ESTMBLISHUENT OF THE MHLTMRY STMFF COMMITTEE
    In pursuance of Article 47 of the Charter and for purposes laid down in that and other articles of the Charter, the Lilitary Staff Committee has been established by the Security Council,

SECTION II
FUNCTIONS OF THE MILITARY STAFF COMITTEE
Tr:e Military Staff Committee is organised to perform the following functions:-
(a) To edvise and assist the Security Council on all questions relating to the Security Council's military requirements for the maintenance of international peace ard security and, in particular, the prevention and suppression of aggreasion.
(b) To prepare for the Security Council plans for the application of armed force.
(c) To make recommendations to the Sccurity Council for the employment and command, including the designation of comanders, of forces placed at its disposal.
(d) To advise and assist the Security Council on all questions relating to the regulation of arnaments and possible disarmanent, (e) Under the Sccurity Council, to be responsible for and to exercise the strategic direction of armed forces placed at the disposal of the Security Council.
( $\ddagger$ ) With the authorization of the Security Cuncil ind after consultation with appropriate regional agencies, to establish rezional inilitary Staff submconmittees and to direct their activities.
(e) To perform such other functions as the Security Ciuncil nay require.

SECTION III
RELATION BEP TRN THE MILTTARY STAFP COMTYTES, GYE SECURTTY CQUNCIL AND THE SECRERTEY-GHWR:I
(a) The kiilitary Staff Cowittee is the military organ of the Security Council. It is essential that there be a free and reciprocal exchange of infomation between the Security Council. end the Military Staff Committee.
( b Exchange of information is especially necessary during the periods in which efforts are being made to settle disputes by peaceful means.
(c) Infornation will be exchanged by means of official correspondence, personal contact and by attendance, on invitation, at meetings of the Security Cuuncil by iNembers of the Military Staff Committee.
(d) The Chiman of the hilitiary Stuff cmaittee shall personally perforn liaison between the linilitary Suff cumitice and the Secretary-Gencral. The Principal Secretary of the iiilitary Staff Coamittee shall serve as liaison officer between the Cuar ittee ard the Office of the Secretary-General. In this capacity, he shall act under the authority of both the Chairmarn of the dilitary Staff Committee and the Gecretary-General for the purpose of exohnnging
infont tion, transmitting pertinent documents, and mranciruf for conforme: betwen the dilitury Etaff comittee and the secretary-
 Security c uncil arfairs.
(w) Whon ruports, recomendations, or statuments have been aryroved Wy the 'ilitary BLaff Connitter tor subrission t.) the Becurity Cumejl, adwace codiss wida be forwarded to the Secretary-(icneral 1 for his inforartion and files.

SECTION JY

(a) The Eilitary Staff Comittee comsists of the Chicfos of Staff of the Pamanent wombers of the becurity emuncil or their $\therefore$ presentatives.
(t) Wite Rupresentatives of the Chiefs of atoff of ach Nation will consist sf the ufficirg, we from each of the land, sea and air forces, who in the absence of the Chisfe of steff will be kembers of the silitery Otaft Cminittee.
(c) lier. $\%$ nt.atives of any Muber of the United Mations not mermently represented on the kilitary Staff Comittec, invited by the Comeittee (ander Article 47, ramerah? of the Chartar) to be ansocinted with it while required for the afficisnt discharge of its responsitilities shall mot be conadiced memers of the salitary statil Cumithes. iomescontaves of such an associated Nation shall faytiamate in only these prots or a metime (or meetings) to wtich specificelly invited by the ifiltery staif Comaittee.

In order to bo able to parioma its duties towards the Security Guncil, the ifilitary staff Committise shali likewise be so orezenised as to be able to function contirucusly in accordance with directives of tho Sccurity Coursjil and approved plans

In order to be able to perform its duties towards the Security Council, the Military Staff Gommittee shall likewise be so orgenised as to be able to function in accordance with directives of the Sccurity Council and aperoved plans.

SECTION VIII

## STHUCTU:E OF THE MILITHRY STAFF COMMTTUEE

## A. Sub-Comittees.

In order to carry out its functions of organising and liter givine strategic direction to United Mations forcees, and for othor purposes, the lilitary Steff Comattes may establish along general staff lines such permanont or temporary sut-conattees as may be necessary, as for exmole suh-ormattees concemed with such subjecte as operations, inteiligence, logisties, arnamenta, conmunications, trusteeships and others.

Each sub-oomnittee shall consist of not noru than threa Mubers (Army, Navy, dir Furce) from each of the five nations and such assistants as they may require. infy henber may serve on more than one sub-comuttene.

## B. Secretariat

The Secretariat of the Military Staif Committec will be organised as set forth in the document entitled "Fules of Procedure f:or the Military Staff Committee and its Secretariat."

## SECTTON I

MEETENGS AND JGENDA
Ruls I
The Military Staff Comnittee shall hold meetings at the eall of the Chairman whenever thereiis business to be conclucted and the necessary documents have bein prepared, but not more than fourtoen days shall elapse between meetings.

Rule 2

## Chinese, French, U.K. and

 U. Se Delegations ${ }^{1}$ EroposalThe Chairman of the Military Staff Comittee shall call an extraordinary meeting of the Military Staff Committee at the dircetion of the Sccurity Council, or at the request of any Delegation of the Gomittee. No extraordinary meeting can be convened unless evory Delegntion is ropresented. Each Delegation er.ther Mititary.Staff Comuttee shall, for this purpose, be adequately represented at all times at the site of the

Soviet Delegation prolosal
The Chairman of the military Staff Comittoe shall call an extrabrdinary meeting of the Military Staif Conmittee at the direction of the Sccurity

Gouncil, or at the request of any Delcy tion of the Comnittee. No extraordinary meeting can be convened unlese everg Dolegation is represented, Each Delegation of the Nilitary Staff Comuttee shall; for this purpose, be adequately represented et the site of the organisation.

Rule 3
(a) Meatines of the Military Staff Comittee shall be atternded by its members and sceretaries. Each Delegation may be necompanicd at any mietine: by such advisers and technical assistants as it may require either civil or military. Each Delegation shall keop the number of its advisens at mextings as small as practifable.
(b) The Secretary-ienoren, or the issistant Secretary-fencual for the Deprotment of Socurity Conncjl Affairs, ecting on his behalf. normally h?s the right to attend all meetings of the inilitary Staff Committee and make oral or witten statements concerning matters within the scope of the functions and powers of the Socreteryfuneral.
(c) No other fersons excent the above shall attond any meeting of the Mijitary Staff Comrittee except by agreement of all Dolegations.
(a) Within the terns of (b) above, the Secretery-Guncral will be given a copy of the provisional afende of meetiners of the military staff Committee and all pepars reforred to thereon, other than papers applying solely to internal meticra of tho Military Staff Comittee.

Rule 4
The pravisional agenda for aimeeting shall be draw up by the Secritiriat and communcated by the Frincipal Secretary (See Rule s, Paragralin (c)) to the Menbers of the Military Staf Committoe at least three days before the lieelint, but in ungent oircunctances it may be communi cated simultanoously with the notice of the necting.

## Rule 5

The firot itan on the provisionel aronda or any meetins of the Military Staff Comattec shall be the adoption of the agonda.

CH:TMMNSHIP
Gule 6
(a) The Chairmanship of the Military Staff Cumittee shail potate on a monthly basis among the five national Delofetions in Ery lish alphabetical order of the names of thoir countries.
(b) The Chaimmanship of all Sub-Committees will be held on the sue principles as laid down in Paragraph (a) above, and will chango at the sunc: tiane.
(c) The Cheirman shall be only a presidiny officor and shall rarresut, tho Nilitary Stat'f Comittee in its corpornte capacity only in accoranne with ite instructions. Except on the spocial instructions of the 位intry Sterff ouinittee he will den only with the security Council and the Secretary-Gencrel.

## STCTMON III

Rule 7
(a) Wech Rulestion shall heve one spokesman at nuetings of the Militery otraff Gormittes who shall express the officinl views of his own Dekemtion, Dach spokesman may catl on ather Members of his Delegetion to assist hin in presentine the official views of hits own Delegetion to the Hilitary Staff Cmitteé, a sinilar procedure shall armly in Subu Comintess of the milj.tary Staff Committee.
(b) ill recmmendations to the Security Comeil shall be forwarded with the unanimous approval of ell Dolerations. If, however, unanimity cannot be echioved, 3 full statement of all divergent views thall be Fripar $d$ and forwarddd t:s the Security Council. liatters of principle or substsine: shell be decided by unanimous approval.
(c) Should differences of opinion arise with regerd to ratters of intornal rerocedure, each Delestion shall have one vote and the wejority vote shall be bindiner on all jelegations.
(i) in invitation to :embers oi the Unit :d Mations not pemanently reprwantid on the Gecurity Council shall be extended in accordnnee with Articl.: 47, Fare. 2, of the Cherter only with the unaninous approval of the Jilit:ry Staff Comaittee.

## SECTION IV


Rule 8
(:) The Secretariat of the Military Staff Connittee shall consist of
five secrataries, sne fron each Delegation. Each Secrutary shall be designated by his respective Delegation. They will have all the necessary technical assistants, including interpreters, to enable thim to seive the iilitary Staff committee and any subordinate retncies which nay be decided upon by the wilitary Staff comaittee.
(b) The jecretariat will be responsible to the Military Staff Comittee for:-
(i) the handling, reproducing and circulating of all docunents prepared by the Jilitary Staf'f' Committee itsclf, or submitted to the ifilitary Staif' Committee by National ielegations or any other agency or rombers of the United Nations;
(ii) arranging, where necessary, for translations of these documents to he made into other languages;
(iii) making arrangements for all meetings, issuine agendas and circulating these to all Delegetions;
(iv) proparing and circulating to the Dolegzitions rocords (see Section V) of the meutines of the Silitary Steff Comittee end its Suk-Comittees, such records being considered end amended or approved by the Comattee at their following inceting;
(v) rapidly preparing the documents which relatu to the decisions takon in the meetings.
(c) The five Secretaries will heve equal rights and responsibilities In order to comordinate the work of the five secretaries and to manage the Secretariet, a Principal Secretery shall be established. This position shall be: huld in turn by the five Secrataries for the same period as the Chairnan and of the same nationality. The Principal Srerctary will act as a co-ordinetor and not as an excontivu. In his absence, the Secretary next to serve as Principal Secretary shall not in liss stead.
(d) The Secretariat will be an sgency of the Militery Staff
 Secretarint will provide liaison in routine mattera botween the ailitary staff conmitten and the Secretariat of t: $t$ United Nations.
(e) (i) The pormanent subordinate stafi of the Becretariat shall not initially exceed forty-one persons. This number may be varied later as cirenstances ? de mand, (sece frpendices a and b).
(ij) In principle, the staff of the secretariat will be provided equally from the dive natjona,
(iii) All the civilian sterf of the Sucretariat shall be Faid from the Budet of tho Unitud Netions at the same rates as cmprable rank of the United Nations Staff, but with the oxclusive function of serving under the autherity of the witary staf Consiatee.

Wiatary persomel shall be faid by thoir woperive Governsents.
(iv) ilil quections relating to tire torms of employment of the above starf chall be co-ordinatod with the' orfices of the Secretary-inencral of the United Nations by the five secretaries.

The civilian staff shall be governed by tor sme wnernl rules concoming temas of cmployment, su:h os pay, ferontinent, transportation, samation, pronotion and lenve of absence, as govern varjous othor fersomel under the adninistration of the United Nations Secretarint, subject to such temporary financind urranfements as may be necessary for civil servents of their respective goverments who may ke serving on thiporary loan. The
 with the Secretary-General, in time bo pormit hin to prepare his annual budget for submission to the General

Asscmbly, the number and catcegories and rates of pay of these civilians;
(v) The Secretariet shall be located, to ensure the necussary degree of security, in such place as may be designated by the Military Staff Committce and shall bporate under the direct suparvision of the Comnittee. .
(ix) The Secretary-General shall effect, on the monation of the idilitary Staff Committee, apiointenent, suparation, promotion and leave of absence of civilian personnel of the secrotariat of the rilitity Staff comittee.
(vii) The Becretary-Genoral shall mect the adrinistrative and rimucial requirenents of the Cilitary Staff Comaitese in the same manmer as thooe of the other orgens of the United Nations.

SECTION V
RECORDS

## inule 9

Records of muetings will ordimrily be kept in summary form, On diruction of the Eilitary Staff Comititee or nt the request of one or more jelegations a full record of a metine or fart of a necting will be kept.

## MuI $\in 10$.

Subject to the provisjons of Rule 9, the draft records of ench meeting shall be sent as soon as possible to the Eiler tions to the
 receipt or carlice if possible, inform the Secretarist in writing of any corrections which they may desire to have nade. a corrected version of the draft record will then be circulited by the Secretariat in time for consinarstion by the wilitary Staff Comitton ot their next meeting. when approved by the Military Staff Comittea it will be sizned by each peleg tion and will then be regarded as in foree.

## SECTION VI

## IniNQUiGES

Rule 11
(a) Clinese, English, French and :ussian shall be the official landuges of the dilitary Staff comatteo and anglish and trench the working languages. Specchos made in either of the working lenguagos shall be interpreted into the other working language. In special circunstances when technicel subjects are under discussion any Deleg;:tion bey request interpretation of any part of the discussion into any other of ficicial linguages.
(b) Speeches made in either of the tho other official languiges shall be interpreted into both working languagus.
(c) Records of meetings of the Militimy Staff Cmantec shall be drawn up in the working languages. it translation of the whole or part of any of the records int., any of the other official lenguages shell be furnished if requested by any Delegrtion.
(d) All infortant documents shall be made evailable in the official langueges. Upon the rcquest of any Delegation any other document shall be made available in any or all of the official languages.
(e) ill documents originated by the Military Staff Comittee or its agencies shall have equal force in all official languages. All official languages shall be regarded as equally valid.

## SECTION VII

## SECURITY

Rule 12
Unless it decides stherwise, the Military Staf'f Committee shall meet in closed session in order to ensure tho necessary security.

Rule 13.
The Records of the meetings of the Military Staff Comittee, its decisions or documents, or the speeches of its Menbers at mectings, or extracts from any of the above shall not be given to or published by the press without special pemission of the idilitary Staff Comittee and the
work of the ..ilitary Staff Comittee must not be made by individual menbers uxcept when the dilitary Staff Committee authorises such statements to be made.

## Bule 14

All members of Delegations, advisers, assistants and staif of
the secretariat and any other persons who may become associated with the Military Staff Comittec's proceedings, must at all times maintcin the strictest security with regard to all mattels dealt with by the Military Staff Comittee. All civilian employees of the secretariat staff will be required to undertake, in writing, the necessary obligati ns.

## IPPENDIX "4"

QU:RTERMISTER
There shall be provided a uartomaster who, under the direction of the Frincipal Secretary, will:-

1. arrange for the safeguarding of the accommodation assigned
(3) the .ilitary Steff Commttee and Jts Secretariat;
2. make the necessary arrangonents to provide office accommodation for the iilitary Staff Committce, its ayencies and the Secretariat;
3. provide all the necessary suppliss, equipgent, furnishings, etc., required by the Comittee, its agencies and the Secretariat;
4. be responsible for the pay, the conditions of service of the subordinate civilian staff and the financial arrangements in connection therewith;
5. serve as the lieison on all the above matters with the appropriate persons in the United $i_{0}$ ations Secretariet or outside agencies.

This Ouartermaster shall be a netional of one of the five Nations represented at the Military Staff Committee and shall be nominated by the five Secretaries and appointed with the approval of the Military staff Committee.
