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Summary statement by the Secretary-General on matters of which the Security Council is seized and on the stage reached in their consideration

Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The list of items of which the Security Council is seized is contained in documents S/2002/30 of 15 March 2002, S/2002/30/Add.1 of 22 March 2002, S/2002/30/Add.2 of 25 March 2002, S/2002/30/Add.3 of 26 March 2002, S/2002/30/Add.5 of 1 April 2002 and S/2002/30/Add.13 of 9 April 2002.

During the week ending 18 May 2002, the Security Council took action on the following items:

The situation between Eritrea and Ethiopia (*see* S/1998/44/Add.25; S/1999/25/Add.3, 5 and 7; S/2000/40/Add.18, 19, 30, 32, 36, 45 and 46; S/2001/15/Add.6, 11, 16, 20, 37 and 46; and S/2002/30/Add.2, 9 and 10; *see also* S/2001/15/Add.37; and S/2002/30/Add.10)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 4529th and 4530th meetings, held in private on 13 May 2002 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations.

At the close of the 4529th meeting, in accordance with rule 55 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the following communiqué was issued through the Secretary-General in place of a verbatim record:

“At its 4529th meeting, held in private on 13 May 2002, the Security Council considered the item entitled ‘The situation between Eritrea and Ethiopia’.

“The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representative of Eritrea to participate in the discussion of the item without the right to vote, in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Charter and rule 37 of the Council’s provisional rules of procedure.

“The members of the Council and the representative of Eritrea had a constructive discussion.”

At the close of the 4530th meeting, in accordance with rule 55 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the following communiqué was issued through the Secretary-General in place of a verbatim record:

The President drew attention to a draft resolution (S/2002/532) submitted by Bulgaria, China, France, Norway, the Russian Federation, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the United States of America.

The Security Council proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/2002/532, and adopted it unanimously as resolution 1409 (2002) (for the text, *see* S/RES/1409 (2002); to be issued in *Official Records of the Security Council, Fifty-seventh Year, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 2002*).

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 4532nd meeting, held on 14 May 2002 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations, having before it the report of the Security Council mission to the Great Lakes region, 27 April-7 May 2002 (S/2002/537 and Add.1).

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Burundi, the Democratic Republic of the Congo, Rwanda, South Africa and Spain, at their request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 4533rd meeting, held on 16 May 2002 in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations.

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representative of Yugoslavia, at his request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

In accordance with the understanding reached in the Council's prior consultations, the President, with the consent of the Council, extended an invitation under rule 39 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure to Jean-Marie Guéhenno, Under-Secretary-General for Peacekeeping Operations.
