ANNEX

Explanatory memorandum

The greatest disaster in modern Jamaican history occurred on 12 and 13 September 1988 when hurricane Gilbert devastated the island causing massive destruction of buildings and extensive damage to roads and agricultural crops. An estimated five hundred thousand people have been left homeless and total damage to property, agriculture and infrastructure has been estimated at several hundred million dollars. The people and Government of Jamaica are making every effort to help the country recover from the damage. The support and assistance of the international community will also be required in view of the magnitude of the disaster.
