The PRESIDENT (interpretation from Spanish): Pursuant to rule 31 of the rules of procedure, we shall now proceed to the election of the vice-presidents of the General Assembly.

All members of the General Assembly are eligible in this election except those already represented in the General Committee, namely, those countries whose representatives have been elected to the presidency of the General Assembly or to the chairmanships of the Main Committees.

## (The President)

In accordance with paragraphs 2 and 3 of the annex to resolution $33 / 138$, the 21 Vice-Presidents shall be elected according to the following pattern:
(a) Six representatives Erom African States;
(b) Five representativese from Asian States;
(c) One representative from an Eastern European State;
(d) Two representatives from Latin American and Caribioean States;
(e) Two representatives from Western European or other States;
(f) Five representatives from the permanent members of the Security Council.

In accordance with paragraph 16 of annex VI to the rules of procedure, the election of the Vice-presidents of the Assembly by secret ballot shall be dispensed with when the number of candidates corresponds to the number of seats to be filled. In other words, whenever the number of candidates in a given group corresponds to the number of seats to be filled in that group, those candidates shall be declared elected. We shall proceed accordingly.

I shall now read out the names of the candidates endorsed by the regional groups:

African States: Côte d'Ivoire, Guinea-Bissau, the Libyan Arab Jamahiriya, Sao Tome and Principe, Swaziland and the United Republic of Tanzania;

Asian States: Bahrain, Cyprus, Nepal, Thailand and Vanuatu;
Eastern European State: Yugoslavia;
Latin American and Caribbean States: Ecuador and El Salvador:
Western European and other States: Denmark and Malta.
As the number of candidates endorsed by the regional groups corresponds to the number of seats to be filled in each group, I declare those candidates elected, in addition to the representatives of the five permanent members of the security Council.

ADOPTION OF THE AGENDA AND ORGANIZATION OF WORK: LETTER FROM THE CHAIRMAN OF THE COMMITTEE ON CONFERENCES (A/43/599)

The PRESIDENT (interpretation from Spanish): The Assembly will now turn its attention to document A/43/599, which contains a letter dated 9 September 1988 addressed to the President of the Gener al Assembly by the Chairman of the Committee on Conferences. As members are aware, the Assembly, in paragraph 7 of resolution 40/243, decided that no subsidiary organ of the Gener al Assembly should be permitted to meet at United Nations Headquarters during a regular session of the Assembly unless explicitly authorized by the Assembly.

As indicated in the letter I have just mentioned, the committee on conterences has recommended that the General Assembly authorize the Ad Hoc Committee of the Whole to Review and Appraise the United Nations Programme of Action for African Economic Recovery and Development to meet from 20 to 23 September 1988.

Bearing in mind that those dates overlap with the forty-third session of the Assembly, may I take it that the General. Assembly adopts the recommendation of the Committee on Conferences?
